BUDGET FOR SCHOOL-AGE CHILD CARE PROGRAM

Lack of supervision for children before and after school has been identified by superintendents across the state as one of the "three most frequent or urgent unmet needs that surface among students" in their district. A May 1994 survey of 815 North Dakota households also supports this need. When asked what was one of the most serious problems facing other ND children and families, the most frequently cited response was "inadequate supervision of children".

There are 68,893 children currently enrolled in grades K-6 in North Dakota schools. It is estimated that at least 12% of the K-6 children would be in need of school based before- and after-school care for a total of 8.267.

An average cost for a 3 hour program of before- and after-school care for a 9 month school year is \$600/child. Parent fees will cover an estimated 35% of the cost, or \$210 per child per year, leaving \$390 in program costs per child per year. The parent fee is based on an average of \$1.25/hour for a 3 hour program.

10 programs will be identified in each year of the 1995-97 biennium for maximum grants of \$5,000 to start programs, or improve and expand existing programs. This amounts to \$100,000 for 1995-97. The needs of 10 additional programs will be addressed in each year of the 1997-99 biennium for \$100,000.
