Fiscal Note for SB 2159 (cont.)

The law technically does not provide for foundation aid payments for these students, but most districts report them in the average daily membership. Since most of these students are included in the a.d.m., they would be a part of the foundation aid budget request. Therefore, there is no additional impact from this change.

Section 7 relates to the age of school children. It specifically defines the age at which a student's education shall cease to be "free, open, and accessible". This section more clearly defines school age, but does not require additional funding.
