A juvenile's principal or school administrator may share any information received under this section and section 27-20-51 with the juvenile's teachers if the principal or administrator deems it necessary to ensure the safety or well-being of the juvenile or other persons attending, employed by, or otherwise involved with the juvenile's school or school district. Any information shared under this section or subsection 4 of section 27-20-51 must be treated as confidential information. The superintendent of public

instruction shall provide forms and adopt rules under chapter 28-32 for the sharing of information under this section.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 4 of section 27-20-51 of the 1995 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

4. ~~Following an adjudication of delinquency for an offense that would be a felony if committed by an adult, Unless otherwise ordered by a court, the juvenile court may forward the order of disposition to the juvenile's school principal, or chief administrative officer, or designated school guidance counselor, if requested, must be allowed access to the disposition order if:~~
 - a. The juvenile court deems it necessary to ensure the safety or well-being of the juvenile or other persons attending, employed by, or otherwise involved with the juvenile's school or school district; and

5. 6. An agent acting for the receiver of an instrument issued in violation of this section may present the instrument to the state's attorney for prosecution. A criminal complaint for violation of subdivision b of subsection 2 or subdivision b of subsection 3 must be executed within ninety days after the drawer of the instrument receives notice, from the holder, of nonpayment. A complaint for a violation of subsection 4 must be executed within ninety days after the drawer of the instrument receives notice, from the holder, of nonpayment for the last instrument, if any, included under subdivision b of subsection 4 for a violation of subsection 4. Failure to execute a complaint within the time set forth in this subsection bars any criminal charges under subdivision b of subsection 2 or, subdivision b of subsection 3, or subdivision b of subsection 4.

6. 7. A notice of dishonor may be mailed by the holder of the instrument upon dishonor. Proof of mailing may be made by return receipt or by an affidavit of mailing signed by the individual making the mailing. The notice must be in substantially the following form:
