NORTH DAKOTA WORKERS COMPENSATION BUREAU 1997 LEGISLATION SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION

BILL DESCRIPTION: Roughrider Industries / Inmate Work Programs

BILL NO: EHB 1116

SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION: The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, has reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

The proposed bill requires the Bureau to offer "modified workers compensation coverage" (MWCC) to inmates incarcerated in State penitentiaries or affiliated institutions. Disability benefits under MWCC will begin to accrue when the injured inmate is discharged from the penitentiary. The penitentiary will pay all reasonable medical expenses while the injured inmate is incarcerated. Roughrider will be required to reimburse the Bureau for claim benefit costs charged against the classification in excess of the premiums and medical expenses paid, in addition to administrative costs pertaining to issuing a policy and claims adjudication. Roughrider will be required to purchase excess insurance to cover claim benefit costs in excess of premium and medical expenses paid. The proposed bill provides for reimbursement to the Workers' Compensation fund from the state general fund for any liability incurred by the Bureau as a result of the discontinuation of the Roughrider program or any liabilities incurred in excess of the policy limits of the reinsurance or excess coverage secured by Roughrider Industries and requires review of the program after two years by way of a sunset clause.

FISCAL IMPACT: Anticipate no rate level impact as the Bureau will be reimbursed for all costs in excess of premiums arising out of injuries incurred by Roughrider Industries. Rates will need to be established for MWCC. Anticipate no reserve level impact due to prospective application.

AMENDMENT: The proposed amendment adds language allowing the Bureau to provide vocational rehab services when warranted while an inmate is incarcerated; adds language exempting the Bureau from providing the required excess or reinsurance coverage under Section 6 of this Act; adds a new section to the bill requiring a safety and performance audit of roughrider industries work programs; and extends the sunset clause to the year 2003 instead of 1999.

The proposed amendment will result in no significant change to the fiscal impact for the bill as introduced.
