Narrative: This bill provides that student payments (extended from only high school students) for cooperating and reorganized school districts will not be less than the payments would have been had the school districts not cooperated or reorganized. Four existing reorganized districts will become eligible for increased payments for their elementary students. Existing cooperating district payments will not be affected.
