## NORTH DAKOTA WORKERS COMPENSATION BUREAU 1997 LEGISLATION SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION

**BILL DESCRIPTION: Definitions** 

**BILL NO: HB 1269** 

**SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION:** The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, has reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

Removes unnecessary language, provides clarifying language to accommodate the claims and policyholder services processes. Relocates substantive language to appropriate sites in Title 65. Changes references to ccommodate the proposed amendments.

**FISCAL IMPACT: None** 

**AMENDMENT:** The proposed amendments clarify that injuries resulting from altercations are compensable if job duties of the employee require them to undertake activities which may result in an altercation; amends the presumption clause identifying compensability of injuries and diseases incurred by firefighters and law enforcement officers to keep it in it's current form; adds language pertaining to an employee's entitlement to benefits when the employee refuses to submit to drug and aclohol testing when mandated by company policy; and requires the bureau to conduct a study of its current benefit structure and report its findings to an interim committee designated by the legislative council.

It is anticipated the proposed amendments will result in no significant impact.
