It is not known how many cities would choose to do so. Approximately \$550,000,000 in total taxable sales and purchases are reported annually by cities with populations less than 1500. If one assumes 1% growth could be attributable to new businesses in cities		
where the exemption is granted, the fiscal effect would be a revenue loss of approx. \$275,000 per year.
