The Industrial Commission receives legal advice from the Attorney General's Office for all its agencies. This fiscal note reflects the additional cost of obtaining independent counsel for all the Commission agencies whether special fund or General Fund. Special funds also include legal costs currently paid from bond issues. The Attorney General's Office hourly charge averages \$45.00. The calculations in this fiscal note utilize an independent counsel hourly rate of \$90.00. However, we know that costs would be higher (bond counsel \$120 and oil and gas \$125). This fiscal note reflects a decrease of \$418,606 from the Attorney General's Office from revenues the Attorney General's Office is projecting they will receive from Special Funds and an increase of \$963,887 in General Fund and Special Fund expenditures for a net increase of \$545,281. The number of hours used in these calculations was based on the actual number of hours worked for the period beginning with fiscal year 1994 through December 1996.
