## NORTH DAKOTA WORKERS COMPENSATION BUREAU 1997 LEGISLATION SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION

BILL DESCRIPTION: Premium calculation for township officer coverage based on actual wages.
BILL NO: SB 2383
<b>SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION:</b> The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, has reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.
Proposed legislation provides for a township officer's premium calculation to be based on actual wages earned at the standard maximum payroll cap which is currently used.
FISCAL IMPACT: No significant impact. However, will serve to increase premium collections due to increase in the number of townships electing to provide optional coverage for their officers.
<b>AMENDMENT:</b> The proposed amendment removes the cross-reference language from the bill as introduced. Amendment does not change the intent or the effect of the proposed bill.
