- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-38 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to teacher certification requirements; and to provide an appropriation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15-38 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Teacher certification - National teacher's examination. As a condition of initial certification, the education standards and practices board shall require that an applicant pass the basic portion of the national teacher's examination. As a condition of any recertification, the education standards and practices board shall require that an applicant pass the full national teacher's examination. The education standards and practices board shall place any teacher who fails to pass the national teacher's examination for recertification on probation for a period of six months. If within that time the individual seeking recertification is not able to successfully pass the national teacher's examination, the board shall deny recertification. An applicant for initial certification or recertification must bear the cost of the national teacher's examination.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.

- 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of awarding teacher professional development grants to school districts, for the biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001.
- 2. a. Each school district is entitled to receive a grant as provided in this Act not exceeding \$50,000, provided the district submits an application to the superintendent of public instruction outlining its proposal for expending the funds and the superintendent approves the application.

- b. The superintendent of public instruction may not approve an application for grant funds unless the application includes specific information regarding the type of teacher professional development activities to be provided, how the provided activities will contribute to the implementation of the district's comprehensive professional development plan, the time, place, and manner in which the activities will be provided, a list of participants and presenters, a list of specific teacher, school, and school district needs to be addressed and a description of the manner in which the activities will meet these needs, and the method to be used for assessing both the teacher professional development activities and any changes in teacher effectiveness and student learning resulting from the activities.
- c. The superintendent of public instruction may develop additional criteria for the approval of grant applications under this section.
- No teacher professional development activities funded under this Act may take
 place during hours of classroom instruction that are counted toward a full day of
 instruction for purposes of foundation aid.
