- A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 25-06-02, 25-06-04, and 25-06-09 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the duties of the school for the blind, qualifications for
- 3 admission, and duty to report blind persons; and to repeal section 25-06-07 of the North Dakota
- 4 Century Code, relating to instruction at the school for the blind.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 25-06-02 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 **25-06-02.** Object Duties and responsibilities of school for the blind. The school for
- 9 the blind is a statewide resource and referral center for the provision of services to all blind or
- 10 <u>visually impaired</u> residents of this state, including vision specific consultations, evaluations,
- 11 information, and training and loans of adaptive devices, equipment, and materials. It shall
- 12 receive and educate blind and partially blind children who are residents of this state and who,
- 13 because of this handicap, are not able to receive an appropriate education in the public schools
- 14 of this state. For purposes of this chapter, a blind person is an individual who is totally blind or
- 15 whose central visual acuity does not exceed twenty/two hundred in the better eye with
- 16 corrective lenses, or the widest diameter of the visual field is no greater than twenty degrees;
- and a visually impaired person is an individual with an impairment in vision which, even with
- 18 <u>correction, adversely affects the individual's functional ability. The school for the blind shall:</u>
- 19 <u>1. Collect and distribute information on vision service programs available in the state.</u>
- 20 2. Assist residents to access appropriate vision services.
- 21 <u>3.</u> <u>Provide vision services, including vision-specific consultations, evaluations, </u>
- 22 <u>information, training, and loans of adaptive devices, equipment, and materials.</u>
- 23 <u>4. Receive and educate blind or visually impaired residents of this state who, because</u>
- of being blind or visually impaired, are not able to receive an appropriate education

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1	in the public schools of this state. The school for the blind's education services
2	must include instruction in general subjects and instruction in vision-specific
3	subjects, including orientation, mobility, braille, braille music, daily living skills,
4	technology, vocational training, and recreation.
5	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 25-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
6	amended and reenacted as follows:
7	25-06-04. Qualifications for admission to school for the blind - Residents of state
8	entitled to free education. Applicants for admission to the school for the blind must be blind o
9	partially blind visually impaired and unable to make suitable progress in the public schools of
10	the state. The superintendent, with the approval of the superintendent of public instruction, ma
11	determine the age required for admission. The superintendent shall furnish application blanks
12	upon request, and no person may be admitted to the institution until the application giving such
13	information as the superintendent of public instruction requires has been returned to and
14	approved by the superintendent of the school for the blind. An applicant admitted to the school
15	for the blind must be furnished transportation by the school as provided in the student's
16	individualized education program at the most economical rate possible, and yet meet the
17	student's needs. Each such applicant who is a resident of this state and who, because of
18	blindness and other handicaps is unable to receive an education in the public schools, is
19	entitled to receive an education in the school for the blind at the expense of the state.
20	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 25-06-09 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
21	Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
22	25-06-09. Blind persons - Duty to report. It is the duty of every Every public school
23	superintendent, physician, ophthalmologist, oculist, optometrist, nurse, clinic, hospital, and
24	social and welfare agency in this state to shall report in writing to the superintendent of the
25	North Dakota school for the blind the name, age, and residence of persons under the age of
26	twenty-one years who are blind within the definition of blindness as set forth in this section
27	chapter, and in such cases to furnish such additional pertinent information as the
28	superintendent of the North Dakota school for the blind may request. All reports must be
29	forwarded to the superintendent of the school for the blind within thirty days after diagnosis,

examination, or discovery. For the purposes of this chapter, a blind person is defined as one

who is totally blind or whose central visual acuity does not exceed twenty/two hundred in the

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- 1 better eye with corrective lenses, or the widest diameter of the visual field is no greater than
- 2 twenty degrees.
- 3 **SECTION 4. REPEAL.** Section 25-06-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 4 repealed.
