- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision e of subsection 3 of section 54-52-17,
- 2 subdivision b of subsection 4 of section 54-52-17, subsection 9 of section 54-52-17, and section
- 3 54-52-17.11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to disability retirement, normal
- 4 retirement benefits, retirement benefit options, and postretirement adjustments for supreme and
- 5 district court judges under the public employees retirement system; and to repeal section
- 6 54-52-17.12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to postretirement adjustments for
- 7 supreme and district court judges under the public employees retirement system.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subdivision e of subsection 3 of section 54-52-17 of the
10 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
e. Disability retirement date is the first day of the month after a member

12	becomes permanently and totally disabled, according to medical evidence
13	called for under the rules of the board, and has completed at least one
14	hundred eighty days of eligible employment. For supreme and district court
15	judges, permanent and total disability is based solely on a judge's inability to
16	perform judicial duties arising out of physical or mental impairment, as
17	determined pursuant to rules adopted by the board or as provided by
18	subsection 3 of section 27-23-03. A member is eligible to receive disability
19	retirement benefits only if the member:

- (1) Became disabled during the period of eligible employment; and
 (2) Applies for disability retirement benefits within twolve menths of the
- (2) Applies for disability retirement benefits within twelve months of the date the member terminates employment.
- 23A member is eligible to continue to receive disability benefits as long as the24permanent and total disability continues and the member submits the

2		boar	d, or for as long as the member participates in a rehabilitation program
3		requi	red by the board, or both. If the board determines that a member no
4		longe	er meets the eligibility definition, the board may discontinue the disability
5		retire	ment benefit. The board is authorized to may pay the cost of any
6		medi	cal testing or rehabilitation services it deems necessary and these
7		payn	nents are hereby appropriated from the retirement fund for those
8		purp	oses.

10	1999 Supplemer	nt to th	e North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	b.	Sing	le life Normal retirement benefits for all supreme and district court judges
12		unde	r the public employees retirement system reaching normal retirement
13		date	equal an annual amount, payable monthly, comprised of a benefit as
14		defin	ed in this chapter, which must be determined as follows:
15		(1)	Benefits must be calculated from the time of appointment or election to
16			the bench and must equal three and one-half percent of final average
17			salary multiplied by the first ten years of judicial service, two and eighty
18			hundredths percent of final average salary multiplied by the second ten
19			years of judicial service, and one and one-fourth percent of final
20			average salary multiplied by the number of years of judicial service
21			exceeding twenty years.
22		(2)	Service benefits must include, in addition, an amount equal to the
23			percent specified in subdivision a of final average salary multiplied by
24			the number of years of nonjudicial employee service and employment.
25		(3)	A participant who retired before August 1, 1995, is entitled to benefits
26			calculated at two and eighty hundredths percent multiplied by the
27			second ten years of judicial service, with the increased benefits payable
28			beginning August 1, 1995.
29	SECTIO	N 3. A	MENDMENT. Subsection 9 of section 54-52-17 of the 1999 Supplement
30	to the North Dak	ota Ce	entury Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

1	9.	The board shall promulgate regulations adopt rules providing for the receipt of			
2		retirement benefits in the following optional forms:			
3		a. <u>Single life.</u>			
4		b. Joint and survivor, with fifty percent or one hundred percent options.			
5	b.	c. Level social security option, which shall be is available only to early retirees			
6		members who retire prior to attaining the age at which they may begin to			
7		receive unreduced social security benefits.			
8	C.	d. Life with five-year or ten-year certain options.			
9		Unless Except for supreme and district court judges, unless a member specifically			
10		requests that the member receive benefits according to one of these options at the			
11		time of applying for retirement, all retirement benefits must be in the form of a			
12		single life benefit. For supreme and district court judges, unless a member			
13	specifically requests that the member receive benefits according to one of these				
14		options at the time of applying for retirement, all retirement benefits must be in the			
15		form of a lifetime monthly pension with fifty percent of the benefit continuing for the			
16		life of the surviving spouse, if any.			
17	SEC	TION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 54-52-17.11 of the 1999 Supplement to the North			
18	8 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:				
19	9 54-52-17.11. Judges postretirement adjustments. A supreme or district court judge				
20	or that person's beneficiary who, on December 31, 1997 2001, is receiving retirement benefits				
21	under subdivision b of subsection 4 of section 54-52-17 is entitled to receive an increase in				
22	benefits equal to two percent of the individual's present benefits with the increase payable				
23	beginning January 1, 1998 2002. A supreme or district court judge or that person's beneficiary				
24	who, on December 31, 1998 2002, is receiving retirement benefits under subdivision b of				
25	subsection 4 of section 54-52-17 is entitled to receive an increase in benefits equal to two				
26	percent of the individual's present benefits with the increase payable beginning January 1, 1999				
27	<u>2003</u> .
