PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE AND HOUSE RULES 602

1	SEC	TION 1. AMENDMENT. Senate Rule 602 is amended as follows:
2	602.	DIVIDED COMMITTEE REPORT.
3	1.	In case all the members of any committee required or entitled to report on any
4		subject referred to them cannot agree upon any report, the majority and minority
5		may each make a report as provided by this rule; and all reports, if decorous in
6		language, and respectful to the Senate, must be entered at length in the journal,
7		and must be announced by the Secretary as provided in Senate Rule 601.
8	2.	A minority report must be signed by at least two members of the committee, or
9		three members of the Appropriations Committee, who voted against the majority
10		report and who have not voted for or signed any other report. A member may not
11		vote for a report and refuse to sign that report.
12	3.	The majority report is either the report signed by the largest number of committee
13		members or the report signed by the committee chairman if that report is one of
14		two or more reports signed by the largest and an equal number of members. The
15		majority report must be placed on the calendar for consideration before
16		consideration of any minority report. Minority reports must be placed on the
17		calendar in order in accordance with the number of committee members signing
18		the reports, with the report signed by the largest number of members being placed
19		on the calendar first.
20	4.	If more than one amendment is recommended by divided reports relating to a
21		particular measure, the President shall direct that they be placed on the calendar
22		in order in accordance with this rule.
23	5.	The President shall also rule as to the effect of the adoption of the first report on
24		each subsequent report.
25	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. House Rule 602 is amended as follows:
26	602.	DIVIDED COMMITTEE REPORT.

1. In case all the members of any committee required or entitled to report on any subject referred to them cannot agree upon any report, the majority and minority may each make a report as provided by this rule; and all reports, if decorous in language, and respectful to the House, must be entered at length in the journal, and must be announced by the Chief Clerk as provided in House Rule 601.

- 2. A minority report must be signed by at least three members of the committee, or four members of the Appropriations Committee, who voted against the majority report and who have not voted for or signed any other report. A member may not vote for a report and refuse to sign that report.
- 3. The majority report is either the report signed by the largest number of committee members or the report signed by the committee chairman if that report is one of two or more reports signed by the largest and an equal number of members. The majority report must be placed on the calendar for consideration before consideration of any minority report. Minority reports must be placed on the calendar in order in accordance with the number of committee members signing the reports, with the report signed by the largest number of members being placed on the calendar first.
- 4. If more than one amendment is recommended by divided reports relating to a particular measure, the Speaker shall direct that they be placed on the calendar in order in accordance with this rule.
- 5. The Speaker shall also rule as to the effect of the adoption of the first report on each subsequent report.

NOTE: This proposed rules amendment is in response to questions on whether a member could vote for (and sign) a majority report and then vote for (but not sign) a minority report and whether committee members should be able to sign more than one minority report or vote for more than one minority report but sign only one.

A related question is whether a committee report, other than a conference committee report, should indicate whether a member refused to sign the report. In effect, a member can vote for a report, but then refuse to sign the report. Should the practice of recording in the journal whether a member voted for a report but refused to sign the report be changed so that the report only indicate the members who signed?
