## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE AND HOUSE RULES 602

**SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Senate Rule 602 is amended as follows:

## 602. DIVIDED COMMITTEE REPORT.

- In case all the members of any committee required or entitled to report on any
   subject referred to them cannot agree upon any report, the majority and minority
   may each make a report as provided by this rule; and all both reports, if decorous
   in language, and respectful to the Senate, must be entered at length in the journal,
   and must be announced by the Secretary as provided in Senate Rule 601.
- 8 2. A minority report must be signed by at least two members of the committee, or
  9 three members of the Appropriations Committee, who voted against the majority
  10 report.
- 113. The majority report is either the report signed by the largest number of committee12members or the report signed by the committee chairman if that report is one of13two or more reports signed by the largest and an equal number of members. The14majority report must be placed listed on the calendar for consideration before15consideration of any the minority report. Minority reports must be placed on the16calendar in order in accordance with the number of committee members signing17the reports, with the report signed by the largest number of members being placed
- 18 on the calendar first.
- If more than one amendment is recommended by divided reports relating to a
   particular measure, the President shall direct that they be placed on the calendar
   in order in accordance with this rule.
- 5. The President shall also rule as to the effect of the adoption of the first one report
  on each subsequent the other report.

24 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** House Rule 602 is amended as follows:

## 25 602. DIVIDED COMMITTEE REPORT.

In case all the members of any committee required or entitled to report on any
 subject referred to them cannot agree upon any report, the majority and minority

- may each make a report as provided by this rule; and all both reports, if decorous
   in language, and respectful to the House, must be entered at length in the journal,
   and must be announced by the Chief Clerk as provided in House Rule 601.
- A minority report must be signed by at least three members of the committee, or
  four members of the Appropriations Committee, who voted against the majority
  report.
- 73. The majority report is either the report signed by the largest number of committee8members or the report signed by the committee chairman if that report is one of9two or more reports signed by the largest and an equal number of members. The10majority report must be placed listed on the calendar for consideration before11consideration of any the minority report. Minority reports must be placed on the12calendar in order in accordance with the number of committee members signing
- the reports, with the report signed by the largest number of members being placed
  on the calendar first.
- If more than one amendment is recommended by divided reports relating to a
   particular measure, the Speaker shall direct that they be placed on the calendar in
   order in accordance with this rule.
- 18 5. The Speaker shall also rule as to the effect of the adoption of the first one report
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- on each subsequent the other report.

**NOTE:** This proposed rules amendment is in response to a question on the total number of minority reports allowed under current rules. Although the rules require a minority report to be signed by members who did not sign the majority report, the rules do not limit the number of minority reports those members could make. The approach taken by this rules amendment is to permit only one minority report. Another proposed rules amendment (LC #19084.01) takes a different approach.
