BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-10.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 **39-10.1-01.** Effect of chapter Penalty for violation.
 - 1. It is unlawful for any person to do any act forbidden or fail to perform any act required in this chapter. Any A person who violates any of the provisions of this chapter may be assessed a fee not to exceed five twenty dollars. In the case of a first conviction within a twelve-month period for the failure to use an appropriate protective bicycle helmet, cart, or restraining seat, a court may waive the fee upon receipt of satisfactory proof that, since the date of the violation, the person in violation has purchased or obtained the appropriate equipment and uses and intends to use the appropriate equipment whenever required by this chapter.
 - The parent of any child and the guardian of any ward may not authorize or knowingly permit any such that parent's child or that guardian's ward to violate any of the provisions of this chapter.
 - 3. These provisions applicable to bicycles apply This chapter applies to a bicycle whenever a that bicycle is operated upon any highway or upon, any path set aside for the exclusive use of bicycles, or any path primarily used by bicycles and pedestrians, subject to those exceptions stated herein within this chapter.

1 **SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 39-10.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 created and enacted as follows: 3 **Definitions.** In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires: 4 1. "Protective bicycle helmet" means a piece of headgear that meets or exceeds the 5 impact standards for protective bicycle helmets set by the American national 6 standards institute or the Snell memorial foundation. 7 "Restraining seat" means a seat separate from the saddle seat of the operator of 2. 8 the bicycle which is fastened securely to the frame of the bicycle and is adequately 9 equipped to restrain the passenger in the seat and protect the passenger from the 10 moving parts of the bicycle. 11 **SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 39-10.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 12 created and enacted as follows: 13 Requirements for helmet and restraining seat use. 14 A minor may not operate or be a passenger on a bicycle or in a cart pulled by a 15 bicycle unless the minor wears a protective bicycle helmet of good fit fastened 16 securely upon the head with the straps of the helmet. 17 An individual may not be a passenger on a bicycle unless that individual is able to 2. 18 maintain an erect, seated position on the bicycle and that individual is seated alone 19 on a saddle seat. With respect to an individual who weighs less than forty pounds 20 [18.14 kilograms] or is less than forty inches [101.60 centimeters] in height, the 21 individual must be properly seated in and adequately secured to a restraining seat 22 or, if in a cart pulled by a bicycle, must be properly seated in and adequately 23 secured to the cart. 24 <u>3.</u> A person may not rent or lease a bicycle to or for the use of a minor unless the 25 minor is in possession of a protective bicycle helmet of good fit at the time of the 26 rental or lease; or the rental or lease includes a protective bicycle helmet of good

fit, and the minor intends to wear the helmet as required by this section.
