- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 20.1-01-17 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to posting of lands to prohibit hunting.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-01-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

20.1-01-17. Posting of lands by owner or tenant lessee to prohibit hunting - How posted - Signs defaced and markings protected. Only the owner or tenant lessee of any land may post it by placing signs a sign and markings alongside the public highway or the land giving notice that no hunting is permitted on the land. The name of the person posting the land must appear on each the sign in legible characters. The signs sign must be readable from the outside of the land and must be placed conspicuously not more than eight hundred eighty yards [804.68 meters] apart at the entrance to the land. As to land entirely enclosed by a fence or other enclosure, posting of signs a sign at or on all gates through the fence or enclosure the entrance and marking corner posts with not less than fifty square inches [322.5800 square centimeters] of fluorescent orange paint or, if metal fenceposts are used, covering the entire post, constitutes a posting of all the enclosed land. No A person may not in any manner deface, take down, or destroy posting signs or markings.
