- a. Class A authorized emergency vehicles means:
- (1) Vehicles of a governmentally owned fire department.
- 9 (2) Vehicles when operated by or under the control of a police officer 10 having authority to enforce the provisions of this title or by a salaried 11 employee of a municipal police department within the municipality or by 12 a sheriff or deputy sheriff not including special deputy sheriffs, or by the 13 director of the department of corrections and rehabilitation and the 14 director's authorized agents who have successfully completed training 15 in the operation of class A authorized emergency vehicles.
- 16 (3) Vehicles clearly identifiable as property of the department of corrections
 17 and rehabilitation when operated or under the control of the director of
 18 the department of corrections and rehabilitation.
 - (4) Ambulances Emergency medical services vehicles.
- 20 (5) Vehicles operated by or under the control of the director, district deputy
 21 director, or a district deputy game warden of the game and fish
 22 department.
- 23 (6) Vehicles owned or leased by the United States and used for law
 24 enforcement purposes.

18	amended and reenacted as follows:					
19	39-10-03.2. Class C authorized emergency vehicles. All class B specifications apply					
20	to class C authorized emergency vehicles except that a rotating blue flashing light must be					
21	displayed in place of an amber light as provided in section 39-10-03.1. With respect to vehicles					
22	used by state and local disaster emergency services personnel, the division of emergency					
23	management is responsible for adopting rules for the use of flashing blue lights in accordance					
24	with chapter 28-32.

3	<u>2.</u>	Subsection 1 applies only when:	
4		<u>a.</u>	The authorized emergency vehicle is displaying a blue rotating flashing light
5			or blue strobe light; and
6		<u>b.</u>	It is necessary for the operator to operate the class C emergency vehicle
7			under the conditions listed in subsection 1 for the immediate protection of life
8			or property or in response to a reported emergency or disaster involving
9			possible personal injury, death, or damage to property.
