- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 16.1-08.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to political activities by labor organizations; to amend and reenact
- 3 section 16.1-08.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of a labor
- 4 organization; and to provide a penalty.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-08.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code
  is amended and reenacted as follows:
  - **16.1-08.1-01. Definitions.** As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise plainly requires:
    - 1. "Association" means any club, association, union, brotherhood, fraternity, organization, or group of any kind of two or more persons, including labor unions, trade associations, professional associations, or governmental associations, which is united for any purpose, business, or object and which assesses any dues, membership fees, or license fees in any amount, or which maintains a treasury fund in any amount. The term does not include corporations, cooperative corporations, limited liability companies, political committees, or political parties.
    - 2. "Candidate" means an individual who seeks nomination for election or election to public office.
    - 3. "Contribution" means a gift, subscription, loan, advance, or deposit of money, made for the purpose of influencing the nomination for election, or election, of any person to public office or aiding or opposing the circulation or passage of a statewide initiative or referendum petition or measure. Contribution also means a contract, promise, or agreement, express or implied, whether or not legally enforceable, to make a contribution for any of the above purposes, and includes

13		SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 16.1-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
14	4 created and enacted as follows:			
15	Limits on labor organization contributions - Penalty.			
16		<u>1.</u>	Noty	withstanding any other provision of law, dues paid to a labor organization by
17			emp	ployees may not be expended for political purposes. A labor organization may
18			make contributions or expenditures if the labor organization establishes a separate	
19			<u>seg</u> ı	regated fund to be used for political purposes and:
20			<u>a.</u>	Contributions to the political fund are solicited independently from any other
21				solicitation by the labor organization, and the purpose for the political fund is
22				clear and unambiguous on the face of the solicitation;
23			<u>b.</u>	Dues or other fees for membership in the labor organization are not used for
24				political purposes, transferred to the segregated political fund, or intermingled
25				in any way with political fund moneys;
26			<u>C.</u>	The cost of administering the political fund is paid from fund contributions and
27				not from dues or other fees for membership in the labor organization;
28			<u>d.</u>	The labor organization, when soliciting money for the political fund from an
29				employee, informs the employee of the fund's political purpose and informs
30				the employee of the employee's right to refuse to contribute without fear of

reprisal or loss of membership in the labor organization;

- e. The contribution to the political committee was not secured by physical force,
   job discrimination, membership discrimination, economic reprisals, or threat of
   force.
- 4 2. A labor organization that willfully violates this section is guilty of an infraction.
