# ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1021

Introduced by

**Appropriations Committee** 

(At the request of the Governor)

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the extension

2 service, northern crops institute, upper great plains transportation institute, and the experiment

3 centers; to provide for dairy diagnostic teams; to provide statements of legislative intent; and to

4 amend and reenact sections 4-05.1-02, 4-05.1-04, 4-05.1-16, 4-05.1-17, 4-05.1-18, 4-05.1-19,

5 4-05.1-21, and 4-08-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the state board of

6 agricultural research.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 9 funds as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in 10 the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal 11 funds and other income to the North Dakota state university extension service, the northern 12 crops institute, the upper great plains transportation institute, and the North Dakota agricultural 13 experiment centers for the purpose of defraying the expenses of their various divisions, for the 14 biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001, as follows:

19 SECTION 2. ADDITIONAL INCOME - APPROPRIATION. Any additional income 20 including funds from the federal government and gifts and donations from private sources 21 received by the North Dakota agricultural experiment station, northern crops institute, upper 22 great plains transportation institute, and the North Dakota state university extension service, 23 except as otherwise provided by law, is hereby appropriated for the purpose designated in the 24 gift, grant, or donation for the biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001. 25 SECTION 3. UNEXPENDED GENERAL FUND - EXCESS INCOME. Any unexpended 26 general fund appropriation authority to and any excess income received by entities listed in 27 section 1 of this Act are not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 and any 28 unexpended funds from these appropriations or revenues are available during the biennium 29 beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003, and may be expended, as directed by the

state board of higher education, for capital repairs and improvements, equipment, and otherone-time expenditures.

SECTION 4. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. The state board of higher education is
 authorized to approve transfer of funds between line items for each agency included in
 section 1 of this Act and shall notify the office of management and budget within ten days
 following the transfer.

5 SECTION 5. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. Upon approval of the state board of higher 6 education and the state board of agricultural research, the director of the North Dakota 7 agricultural experiment station may transfer appropriation authority from subdivision 4 to 8 subdivision 5 of section 1 of this Act and shall notify the office of management and budget 9 within ten days.

SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - FULL-TIME EQUIVALENTS. The board of
higher education is authorized to adjust or increase full-time equivalent positions as needed,
subject to availability of funds. The board shall report any adjustments to the office of
management and budget prior to the submission of the 2001-03 budget request.

SECTION 7. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. The state board of higher education is authorized to transfer to the entities in subdivisions 1 through 3 and subdivision 5 of section 1 of this Act from subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act up to \$422,400 to provide salary adjustments. The state board of higher education shall notify the office of management and budget within ten days of the transfer.

SECTION 8. <u>Dairy diagnostic teams</u>. <u>The North Dakota state university extension</u>
 service shall appoint regional dairy diagnostic teams consisting of agricultural business
 management professionals, dairy extension specialists, and dairy industry partners such as

22 <u>nutrition specialists, reproductive specialists, and animal health specialists. At the request of a</u>

23 <u>dairy producer, a dairy diagnostic team shall conduct a site visit, offer the dairy producer</u>

24 educational and technological assistance, and develop a strategic plan to enhance the

25 producer's productivity and profitability.

26 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - FUNDING FOR DAIRY DIAGNOSTIC TEAMS.

It is the intent of the fifty-sixth legislative assembly that the North Dakota state university
extension service use up to the sum of \$100,000 of its 1999-2001 biennium appropriation to
develop and operate the dairy diagnostic teams for the biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and
ending June 30, 2001.

SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 4-05.1-02 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

**4-05.1-02.** Agricultural experiment station. The state board of agricultural research and education and the president of North Dakota state university shall control and administer the North Dakota agricultural experiment station subject to the supervision of the state board of higher education. Funds appropriated to the agricultural experiment station may not be commingled with funds appropriated to North Dakota state university. Appropriation requests to defray expenses of the agricultural experiment station must be separate from appropriation requests to defray expenses of North Dakota state university.

SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 4-05.1-04 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

4-05.1-04. Reports. Each center director shall submit an annual report to the station
director as directed by the state board of agricultural research <u>and education</u>. Each report must
set forth in detail the investigations and experiments made during the preceding year,
recommendations for the welfare of the center, the financial condition of the center, how all

16 moneys have been expended, and the results of experiments. The station director shall submit

17 these reports, with a report of the North Dakota state university main research center, to the

18 state board of agricultural research and education and the state board of higher education on or

19 before the first day of September of each year. If the state board of higher education submits a

20 biennial report to the governor and the secretary of state in accordance with section 54-06-04,

21 the report must include a composite of the reports from the main research center and each

22 research extension center.

23 SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 4-05.1-16 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
24 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

4-05.1-16. State board of agricultural research and education - Membership Terms.

- 27 1. The state board of agricultural research <u>and education</u> consists of:
  - a. The president of North Dakota state university;
- 29 b. The vice president of agricultural affairs at North Dakota state university;
- 30 c. The administrator of the agricultural experiment station;

23				extension centers shall serve only through June 30, 1998.
24		3.	At tl	ne completion of each initial term, the term of office for each member is five
25			yea	rs, beginning on July first. No person may be appointed to a second five-year

27		4.	a.	At least ninety days before the conclusion of the initial term of each member
28				appointed by the ag coalition, the ag coalition shall provide to the state board
29				of higher education a list of two or more names from which the state board of
30				higher education shall appoint a successor. Future appointments to these
31				five positions must be made in the same manner. The state board of higher

1		education shall ensure that four out of the five seats are held by agricultural
2		producers.
3	b.	At least ninety days before the conclusion of the initial term of each member
4		appointed by the extension service's multicounty program units, the units
5		through their advisory groups shall provide to the state board of higher
6		education a list of two or more names from which the state board of higher
7		education shall appoint a successor. Future appointments to these five
8		positions must be made in the same manner. The state board of higher
9		education shall ensure that four out of the five seats are held by agricultural
10		producers.
11	SECTION	N 13. AMENDMENT. Section 4-05.1-17 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
12	Dakota Century	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
13	4-05.1-17	7. Compensation of board members - Expenses. Each appointed member
14	of the state boar	d of agricultural research and education is entitled to receive sixty-two dollars
15	and fifty cents pe	er day as compensation for the time actually spent devoted to the duties of
16	office and is entit	tled to receive necessary expenses in the same manner and amounts as state
17	officials for atten	ding meetings and performing other functions of office.
18	SECTION	<b>N 14. AMENDMENT.</b> Section 4-05.1-18 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
19	Dakota Century	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
20	4-05.1-18	3. State board of agricultural research and education - Chairman -
21	Meetings. The	state board of agricultural research and education annually shall elect one of its
22	members to serv	ve as chairman. The board shall meet at the times and locations designated by
23	the chairman in o	consultation with the vice president of agricultural affairs at North Dakota state
24	university.	
25	SECTION	<b>N 15. AMENDMENT.</b> Section 4-05.1-19 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
26	Dakota Century	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
27	4-05.1-19	9. State board of agricultural research and education - Duties. Within the
28	policies of the sta	ate board of higher education, the state board of agricultural research and
29	education is resp	ponsible for the budgeting, supervision, and policymaking responsibilities
30	associated with t	the supervision of the agricultural experiment station and the North Dakota
31	state university e	extension services. The agricultural research and education board shall:

1	1.	Determine the causes of any adverse economic impacts on crops and livestock
2		produced in this state;
3	2.	Develop ongoing strategies for the provision of research solutions to negate
4		adverse economic impacts on crops and livestock produced in this state;
5	3.	Make available financial resources, including grants and salaries, and make
6		available equipment and facilities to implement the strategies developed under
7		subsection 2, subject to approval by the state board of higher education;
8	4.	Develop an annual budget for the operation of the agricultural experiment station
9		and the North Dakota state university extension service;
10	5.	Develop a biennial budget request and submit that request to the state board of
11		higher education on or before March first of each even-numbered year;
12	6.	Maximize the use of existing financial resources, equipment, and facilities to
13		generate the greatest economic benefit from research and extension efforts and to
14		promote efficiency;
15	7.	Annually evaluate the results of research and extension activities and expenditures
16		and report the findings to the legislative council and the state board of higher
17		education;
18	8.	Advise the administration of North Dakota state university regarding the
19		recruitment and selection of the vice president of agricultural affairs, the extension
20		service director, and the station director; and
21	9.	Advise the director of the extension service regarding Develop ongoing strategies
22		for the dissemination of research information and the best practices for
23		management of the extension service.
24	SEC	CTION 16. AMENDMENT. Section 4-05.1-21 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
25	Dakota Cer	ntury Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
26	4-0	5.1-21. State board of agricultural research and education - Apportionment of
27	research f	unds.
28	1.	The state board of agricultural research and education annually shall apportion the
29		proceeds of the agricultural research fund as follows:
30		a. Seventy percent to research activities affecting North Dakota agricultural
31		commodities that account for at least two percent of the gross sales of all

1		agricultural commodities grown or produced in the state. The percentage of	
2		the dollars available for each agricultural commodity under this section may	
3		not exceed the percentage that the gross sales of the agricultural commodity	
4		bear to the North Dakota gross sales of all agricultural commodities grown or	
5		produced during the previous year, as determined by the agricultural statistics	
6		service;	
7		b. Eighteen percent to research activities affecting North Dakota animal	
8		agriculture; and	
9		c. Twelve percent to research activities affecting new and emerging crops in	
10		North Dakota.	
11	2.	The state board of agricultural research and education shall solicit proposals for	
12		research from the public and private sectors and shall appoint committees to	
13		review the proposals and award the agricultural research grants on a competitive	
14		basis. Each committee must consist of a majority of agricultural producers	
15		selected in consultation with the agricultural commodity groups representing	
16		commodities that are the subjects of the proposed research and may include	
17		researchers and other individuals knowledgeable about the proposed area of	
18		research. Whenever possible, the committees shall require that a grant recipient	
19		commit matching funds.	
20	3.	The state board of agricultural research and education shall develop policies	
21		regarding the award of research grants, including requirements for matching funds,	
22		cooperation with other in-state and out-of-state researchers, and coordination with	
23		other in-state and out-of-state proposed or ongoing research projects.	
24	SEC	CTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 4-08-10 of the 1997 Supplement to the North	
25	Dakota Cer	ntury Code is amended and reenacted as follows:	
26	4-08	8-10. Extension agent to submit monthly account of expenditures. The	
27	extension agent shall submit monthly an accurate itemized account of all expenditures incurred		
28	by the agent in the regular conduct of duties to the North Dakota state university extension		
29	service for	examination and audit. When charges are made by an extension agent for money	
30	expended i	n the performance of official duties, all items of one dollar or more expended and	
31	charged for	must be covered by a subvoucher or receipt that must be signed by the person to	

1 whom the money was paid. The subvoucher or receipt must show at what place, on what date, 2 and for what the money expended was paid. The extension agent shall forward the 3 subvouchers or receipts with the bill, claim, account, or demand against the county. When 4 charges are made for transportation expenses, they may not exceed the amounts provided by 5 section 11-10-15, and must be in itemized form showing the mileage traveled, the days when 6 and how traveled, and the purpose thereof, verified by affidavit. The account must be 7 transmitted and recommended for payment by the North Dakota state university extension 8 service which shall audit the same and which may approve or disallow any expense item 9 therein. The state board of agricultural research and education and the president of North 10 Dakota state university shall control and administer the North Dakota state university extension 11 service is under the control, and subject to the supervision, of the state board of higher 12 education. Funds appropriated to the North Dakota state university extension service may not 13 be commingled with funds appropriated to North Dakota state university. An appropriation 14 request to defray expenses of the North Dakota state university extension service must be 15

separate from an appropriation request to defray expenses of North Dakota state university.
