ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2019

1 A BILL for an Act to make an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state game and

2 fish department; and to amend and reenact section 20.1-02-16.1 of the North Dakota Century

3 Code, relating to the minimum balance of the game and fish fund.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 6 funds as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the game and fish 7 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from 8 federal funds and other income, to the state game and fish department for the purpose of 9 defraying the expenses of the various divisions of the department, for the biennium beginning 10 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001, as follows: 11 Salaries and wages \$12,218,261 12 Operating expenses 7,779,014

SECTION 2. LAND HABITAT AND DEER DEPREDATION. The amount of \$2,500,000, or such lesser amount as may be available, for the line item entitled land habitat and deer depredation in section 1 of this Act, is from the habitat and depredation fund, to lease privately owned lands for wildlife habitat to reestablish wildlife population, to improve wildlife habitat on private lands, and to alleviate big game and furbearer depredation for the biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001. These funds may be spent only for the purposes and using the guidelines contained in sections 20.1-03-12.1 and 20.1-02-05.

8 SECTION 3. NONGAME WILDLIFE. The amount of \$60,000, or such lesser amount 9 as may be available, for the line item entitled nongame wildlife in section 1 of this Act, is from 10 the nongame wildlife fund for the purpose of preservation, inventory, perpetuation, and 11 conservation of nongame wildlife, natural areas, and nature preserves in this state for the 12 biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001.

SECTION 4. WATERBANK PROGRAM. The amount of \$200,000, or such lesser amount as may be available, for the line item entitled waterbank program in section 1 of this Act, is from the game and fish department operating fund and must be used to increase water storage and enhance wildlife habitat in North Dakota. Contracts and agreements relating to the waterbank program may be entered into by the director of the game and fish department, in cooperation with the commissioner of agriculture.

SECTION 5. WILDLIFE SERVICES. The amount of \$100,000, or such lesser amount as may be available, for the line item entitled wildlife services in section 1 of this Act, is from the game and fish fund and must be used to provide grants to the wildlife services agency for projects to alleviate wildlife depredation and damage. Projects funded may include projects to alleviate waterfowl depredation and damage and must be approved by the director of the game and fish department.

SECTION 6. PUBLIC ACCESS TO FLOODED AGRICULTURAL LAND - PAYMENTS TO LANDOWNERS. The amount of \$200,000, or such lesser amount as may be available, for the line item entitled land habitat and deer depredation in section 1 of this Act is from the game and fish fund and must be used for providing payments to landowners with flooded agricultural land, as provided in this section. Payments shall be at the rate of two dollars per year per acre of flooded agricultural land which is taxable as agricultural land and is not normally inundated by water. Payments may be made on a one-time basis for a period not to exceed five years. Fifty-sixth Legislative Assembly

- The conditions under which land qualifies for payments under this section shall be determined
 by the director of the game and fish department and shall include public access to the flooded
 agricultural land.
- 4 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 20.1-02-16.1 of the North Dakota Century Code 5 is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 20.1-02-16.1. Use of game Game and fish fund <u>- Use Required balance Budget</u>
 section approval. All income of the state game and fish department, deposited by the director

with the state treasurer must be credited to the state game and fish fund and the fund may be

- 9 used only by the department. All money derived from the investment of the fund or portions
- 10 thereof of the fund must be credited to the game and fish department private land habitat and
- 11 access improvement fund. The department shall spend moneys in the game and fish fund
- 12 within the limits of legislative appropriations, only to the extent the balance of the fund is not
- 13 reduced below ten million dollars, unless otherwise authorized by the budget section.
