HOUSE BILL NO. 1155

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 64 and a new section to chapter
- 2 64-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to public service commission regulation of
- 3 price scanners and testing of weighing devices; and to amend and reenact sections 64-02-01,
- 4 and 64-02-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to price scanners, transient vendors,
- 5 and fees; and to provide a penalty.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. A new chapter to title 64 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- Definition. As used in this title, "price scanner" means an electronic scanning device
 used to determine the wholesale or retail price of an item by scanning a bar code imprinted on
 the item.
- Misrepresentation of price. A person who misrepresents the price of a commodity
 offered, exposed, or advertised for sale by weight, measure, or count, is, in addition to any
- 14 other penalty provided, subject to a civil penalty not to exceed five thousand dollars. The civil
- 15 penalty may be compromised by the commission. The amount of the penalty when finally
- determined or agreed upon in compromise, if not paid, may be recovered in a civil action in the
- 17 courts of this state.
- 18 Commission to monitor and test wholesale and retail price scanners. The
- 19 commission may monitor and test a price scanner on a random basis. The operator of a price
- 20 scanner is responsible for its accuracy. Monitoring and testing of a price scanner must be done
- 21 according to the guidelines set forth in the national institute of standards handbook no. 130,
- 22 "Examination Procedure for Price Verification". If upon complaint the commission tests a price
- 23 scanner and finds that the price scanner is within the guidelines outlined in handbook no. 130,

- 1 the cost of the test, unless waived by the commission, must be paid by the complainant.
- 2 Otherwise the cost of the test must be paid by the operator of the scanner.
- 3 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 64-02-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 **64-02-01. Definitions.** In this title:

- "Calibrate" means to compare a standard, or weighing or measuring device, to another standard and eliminate by adjustment any variation in the accuracy of the item being compared, but does not include the field repair of a weighing or measuring device.
- 10 2. "Commission" means the public service commission.
 - 3. "Test" means to measure to determine if a standard, or weighing or measuring device, is within the permitted tolerance.
- "Transient vendor" means a wholesale or retail seller of produce, fruit, nuts, or
 seafood that sells to the public at a temporary location, on a seasonal basis, open
 less than one hundred twenty business days each year.
- 16 <u>5.</u> "Weighing or measuring device" means any scale, weight, measure, instrument, or device used or offered for use for weighing or measuring in commerce.
- SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 64-02-10 of the 1997 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

28	When a rejected weighing or measuring device has been reconditioned or replaced by					
29	29 new equipment, it must be retested and certified before being put into use except as otherwise					
30	30 provided by rule. The fee for retest and certification is the same as for the first test and					
31	31 certification.

When a test of a weighing or measuring device is required in addition to the regularly
scheduled annual test, the commission shall charge a fee equal to the cost of operating the
motor vehicle used in conducting the test. The mileage charges, as determined by the
commission, must be in addition to the regular test fee and calculated to cover the costs of the
additional travel. Where a test has been requested and the person requesting it fails to appear
or to have the weighing or measuring device ready for testing at the arranged time, there is a
charge of nine dollars a quarter hour for the time between the arranged time and the time at
which the test can begin.

- **SECTION 4.** A new section to chapter 64-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- Exception from annual test of weighing or measuring device. A weighing or measuring device used to conduct sales by a transient vendor is exempt from this chapter.
