1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-21 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, or in the alternative to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-06 of the

3 North Dakota Century Code, relating to authorizing the superintendent of public instruction to

4 waive any statutes or rules relating to education to encourage innovative education projects.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. If House Bill No. 1034 does not become effective, a new section to
7 chapter 15-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Comprehensive waiver for innovative education project sites.

9 1. The superintendent of public instruction may waive any statutes or administrative 10 rules, except those relating to health, safety, and civil rights, for the purpose of 11 creating an innovative education project site. An innovative education project site 12 is any public school district, school within a public school district, identified student 13 group within a public school, or any state institution operating an educational 14 program approved by the superintendent of public instruction, open and free to all 15 students, which seeks a waiver from statutes and administrative rules in return for 16 establishing an alternate model for accountability based on a clearly-evidenced 17 high level of student performance. A designated innovative education project site 18 in good standing is eligible to apply for any dedicated allocation appropriated by 19 the legislative assembly in addition to the usual state funding for schools. 20 2. The superintendent of public instruction shall develop and implement

21 administrative rules that outline the process school districts or state institutions will 22 follow to prepare an application proposal that details the purpose, administrative 23 organization, instructional program, and matters associated with the development 24 of an innovative education project site. To be considered for an innovative

7			determine if the innovative education project site is making satisfactory		
8			progress toward achieving the objectives described in the innovative		
9			education project site's plan;		
10		k.	An assurance that the applicant will cooperate with the superintendent of		
11			public instruction in evaluating the progress of the innovative education		
12			project site; and		
13		I.	Such other information and assurances as the superintendent of public		
14			instruction may require, as prescribed through administrative rules.		
15	3.	The	The superintendent of public instruction may waive any statutes or administrative		
16		rules	rules and issue an award designation of innovative education project site status to		
17		any	y applicant that meets the application requirements and achieves the		
18		cond	ncurrence of a majority of a waiver committee. The waiver committee must be		
19		com	nposed of one person appointed by the North Dakota education association,		
20		one	e person appointed by the North Dakota council of education leaders, and one		
21		pers	on appointed by the North Dakota school boards association.		
22	4.	The superintendent of public instruction shall develop administrative rules that			
23		outline the selection criteria used by the waiver committee for determining			
24		meritorious applications. These selection criteria must include the following:			
25		a.	The quality of the proposed curriculum and instructional practices;		
26		b.	The contribution that the innovative education project site will make in		
27			assisting educationally disadvantaged and other students to achieve voluntary		
28			state content standards and voluntary state student performance standards		
29			and, in general, continuous educational improvement;		
30		C.	The degree of flexibility afforded to the innovative education project site to		
31			assure its success;		

1		d. The extent of community support demonstrated for the application;			
2		e. The degree of innovation of the objectives for the innovative education project			
3		site;			
4		f. The quality of the strategy for assessing achievement of those objectives; and			
5		g. The likelihood that the innovative education project site will meet those			
6		objectives and improve educational results for students.			
7	5.	Upon approval, an innovative education project site award may be granted for a			
8		period not to exceed three years. An awardee may resubmit its application for			
9		continuation, through the application process, without limitation following each of its			
10		three-year approval cycles. The superintendent of public instruction may limit the			
11		total number of innovation education project sites to no more than twenty awards			
12		during any given time period.
