- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 5-02 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to alcoholic beverage sales; to amend and reenact subdivisions b and e
- 3 of subsection 4 of section 39-08-01 and section 39-08-01.3 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 4 relating to the penalties for operating a vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or
- 5 drugs; to provide a penalty; and to declare an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 5-02 of the North Dakota Century Code iscreated and enacted as follows:

Prohibition on roving sales. An on-sale licensee shall keep, display, and store containers of distilled spirits in an area from which the public is excluded and, before a request to purchase a particular distilled spirit by a customer, may not move a distilled spirit into an area in which the public is allowed, unless the movement is neither part of nor intended to promote the sale of the distilled spirit.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subdivisions b and e of subsection 4 of section 39-08-01 of the North Dakota Century Code are amended and reenacted as follows:

- b. For a second offense within five years, the sentence must include at least four five days' imprisonment of which forty-eight hours must be served consecutively, or ten thirty days' community service; a fine of at least five hundred dollars; and an order for addiction evaluation by an appropriate licensed addiction treatment program.
- e. The execution or imposition of sentence under this section may not be suspended or deferred under subsection 3 or 4 of section 12.1-32-02 except that a fine or a sentence of imprisonment may be suspended in any of the following instances:

1	(1)	Upon conviction of being in actual physical control of a motor vehicle in
2		violation of this section or equivalent ordinance.
3	(2)	If the defendant is under age eighteen when convicted except that if the
4		defendant has, within the preceding five years, previously been
5		convicted of violating section 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance, the
6		sentence must include at least forty-eight consecutive hours
7		imprisonment or in a minimum security facility or at least ten days of
8		community service. The execution of the sentence may not be
9		suspended nor the imposition of sentence deferred under subsection 3
10		or 4 of section 12.1-32-02.
11	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 39-08-01.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
12	amended and reenacted as follows:	
13	39-08-01.3. Al	cohol-related traffic offenses - Ignition interlock devices and the
14	seizure, forfeiture, an	d sale of motor vehicles. A motor vehicle owned and operated by a
15	person upon a highway or upon public or private areas to which the public has a right of access	
16	for vehicular use may be seized, forfeited, and sold or otherwise disposed of pursuant to an	
17	order of the court at the time of sentencing if the person is in violation of section 39-08-01 or an	
18	equivalent ordinance and has been convicted of violating section 39-08-01 or an equivalent	
19	ordinance at least three times one other time within the five years preceding the violation. The	
20	court may also require that an ignition interlock device be installed in the person's vehicle for a	
21	period of time that the	court deems appropriate.
22	SECTION 4. E	MERGENCY. Section 1 of this Act is declared to be an emergency
23	measure.
