- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact sections 39-06-04.1, 39-06-04.2, 39-06-04.3, 39-06-04.4,
- 2 39-06-04.5, and 39-06-04.6 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a graduated motor
- 3 vehicle driver licensing program for minors; to amend and reenact sections 39-06-03,
- 4 39-06-03.1, 39-06-04, 39-06-05, 39-06-07, 39-06-08, and 39-06-17 of the North Dakota Century
- 5 Code, relating to a graduated motor vehicle driver licensing program for minors; and to provide
- 6 an effective date.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-06-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 39-06-03. What persons Persons who may not be licensed. The director may not
 issue any license hereunder:
 - 1. To any person who is under the age of sixteen years, except that the director may issue a restricted permit or license as hereinafter provided in sections 39 06 05 and 39 06 17 to any person who is less than sixteen years of age.
 - 2. To any person whose license has been suspended in this state or in any other state during such the suspension, except as provided in section 39-06.1-03 or 39-06.1-11, nor to any person whose license has been revoked, except as provided in sections 39-06-35 and 39-06-36.
- 19 3. 2. To any person who is an habitual drunkard, or is an habitual user of narcotic drugs,
 20 or is an habitual user of any other drug to a degree which that renders the person
 21 incapable of safely driving a motor vehicle.
- 22 4. 3. To any person who has previously been adjudged to be afflicted with or suffering
 23 from any mental disability or disease and who has not at the time of application
 24 been restored to competency by the methods provided by law.

- 1 5. 4. To any person who is required by this chapter to take an examination, unless such that person has successfully passed such the examination.
- To any person who is required under the laws of this state to deposit security or file proof of financial responsibility and who has not deposited such the security or filed such the proof.
 - 7. 6. To any person when the director has good cause to believe that such the person by reason of physical or mental disability would not be able to operate a motor vehicle with safety upon the highways.
 - 8. 7. To any person when the director has good cause to believe that the operation of a motor vehicle on the highways by such the person would be inimical to public safety or welfare.

 - **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-16-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - **39-16-03.1.** Entries on driver record abstract more than three years old confidential. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, no entry more than three years old or an entry concerning a suspension under subsection 3, 4, 5, or 6, or 7 of section 39-06-03, or subsection 2, 5, or 6 of section 39-06-32, after the suspension ceases, on a driver record or abstract shall be is available to the public, except for statistical purposes, other than by order of a court of competent jurisdiction. The order must be accompanied by a fee of twenty-five dollars.
 - **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 39-06-04. Instructional permit Minimum age Testing. Any person who is at least fourteen years of age may apply to the director for obtain an instruction instructional permit if the person passes a test administered by the director. The director may issue to the applicant an instruction instructional permit which entitles the applicant while having such permit in the permittee's immediate possession to drive a motor vehicle upon the public highways for a period of one year when accompanied by a licensed operator who is at least twenty-two years of age and holds a license corresponding to the vehicle the permittee operates and has had at least one year of driving experience and who is occupying a seat

- 1 beside the driver. Persons holding an instruction instructional permit for the operation of a
- 2 motorcycle shall operate the motorcycle only during hours when the use of headlights is not
- 3 required pursuant to section 39-21-01, and may not carry or transport any passenger. Any
- 4 <u>instruction</u> instructional permit may be renewed or a new permit issued for an additional period.
- 5 A person who is not yet eighteen years of age is not eligible for a <u>restricted</u> license until that
- 6 person has had an instruction instructional permit issued for at least three six months. The
- 7 director may recognize an instruction instructional permit issued by another jurisdiction in
- 8 computing the three-month six-month instructional period.
- 9 **SECTION 4.** Six new sections to chapter 39-06 of the North Dakota Century Code are 10 created and enacted as follows:
- 11 <u>39-06-04.1. Graduated driver licensing Instruction and experience.</u> To ensure
 12 that a minor has both instruction and experience before obtaining an operator's license, driving
 13 privileges are granted on an incremental basis in accordance with the following process:
- 1. An instructional permit.
- 15 2. A restricted license.
- 16 <u>3.</u> <u>An operator's license.</u>
- 17 An instructional permit issued under section 39-06-04 or a restricted license issued under
- 18 section 39-06-04.3 must have a notation that indicates the level of driving privileges granted by
- 19 the permit or license.

- 39-06-04.2. Instructional permit Restrictions. An instructional permit authorizes the permitholder to drive the type or class of motor vehicle specified on the permit only under the following conditions:
 - The permitholder must be in possession of the permit while operating the motor vehicle; and
- 25. The permitholder may drive only when a supervising driver is seated in the front
 26 seat of the vehicle when it is in motion. No individual other than the supervising
 27 driver and the permitholder may be in the front seat unless the vehicle has only a
 28 front seat, in which case, the supervising driver must be seated next to the
 29 permitholder. A supervising driver must hold a valid operator's license and be at
 30 least twenty-two years of age.

1	39-06-04.3. Restricted license - Minimum age. A minor who is at least fourteen			
2	years of age may obtain a restricted license if the minor:			
3	<u>1.</u>	Has held an instructional permit issued by the director for at least six months, and

5		<u>a.</u>	Passed a course of classroom instruction and a course of behind-the-wheel

10		<u>C.</u>	A combination of classes described in subdivisions a and b;	
11	<u>2.</u>	Has	not had a report of a conviction of a traffic offense or admission or adjudication

13	<u>3.</u>	Has passed a road test administered by the director.		
14	39-06-04.4. Restricted license - Restrictions. A restricted license authorizes the			
15	licenseholder to drive the type or class of motor vehicle specified on the restricted license only			
16	under the following conditions:			
17	<u>1.</u>	A re	estricted licenseholder must be in possession of the license while operating the	
18		mot	or vehicle;	
19	<u>2.</u>	A restricted licenseholder may drive without supervision in any of the following		
20		circ	umstances:	
21		<u>a.</u>	From six a.m. to twelve midnight; or	
22		<u>b.</u>	When driving or operating any motor vehicle for the purpose of farming or	
23			ranching, but may carry passengers only during the hours listed in	
24			subdivision a unless accompanied by a supervising driver; and	
25	<u>3.</u>	A re	estricted licenseholder may drive at any time when accompanied by a	
26		sup	ervising driver who is seated in the front seat of the vehicle when it is in motion.	
27		<u>The</u>	supervising driver need not be the only other occupant of the front seat, but	
28		mus	st be seated next to the licenseholder. A supervising driver must hold a valid	
29		mot	or vehicle operator's license and be at least twenty-two years of age. An	
30		indi	vidual holding a restricted driver's license driving a motor vehicle may not carry	
31		mor	re passengers than the vehicle manufacturer's suggested passenger capacity.	

39-06-04.5. Full licensure. A restricted driver's licenseholder who reaches eighteen years of age may obtain an operator's license if the individual's driving privileges are not suspended or revoked.

39-06-04.6. Violations. It is unlawful for the holder of an instructional permit or a restricted license to drive a motor vehicle in violation of the restrictions that apply to the permit or license. Failure to comply with a restriction concerning the permit or license or the failure to comply with the supervising driver requirements constitutes operating a motor vehicle without a license. If a restricted licenseholder who is under eighteen years of age has a report of a conviction or admission or adjudication of a violation of any of the liquor laws in conjunction with the use of a motor vehicle, or has accumulated six or more points on that person's driving record during any previous twelve consecutive months, the license privilege must be returned to the permit level following completion of any period of suspension or other penalty so imposed.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

39-06-05. Restricted instruction instructional permit - When instruction instructional permit not required.

- 1. The director upon receiving proper application may issue a restricted instruction instructional permit effective for a school year or more restricted period to an applicant who is at least fourteen years of age and enrolled in a commercial driver training course which includes practice driving and which is approved by the superintendent of the highway patrol pursuant to chapter 39-25. Such instruction instructional permit entitles the permittee when the permittee has such a permit in the permittee's immediate possession to operate a motor vehicle only on a designated highway or within a designated area but only when an approved instructor is occupying a seat beside the permittee.
- 2. Any student who is at least fourteen years of age and enrolled in behind-the-wheel driver's training through a high school program approved by the superintendent of public instruction may operate a motor vehicle, under the supervision of a driver training instructor certified by the superintendent of public instruction, without a permit or license to operate a motor vehicle; provided, that the school district sponsoring the driver's training program has an insurance policy covering any

damage which may be done by any such student while operating the vehicle, and provided further that proof of coverage is filed with the superintendent of public instruction by the school district's insurance carrier. The insurance coverage must be in the amount required under section 39-16.1-02.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

39-06-07. Application for license or instruction instructional permit.

- 1. Every application for an instruction instructional permit, a restricted license, or for an operator's license must be made upon a form furnished by the director.
- 2. Every application must state the full name, date of birth, sex, residence and mailing address, and briefly describe the applicant. In signing the application the applicant is deemed to have certified that all information contained on the application is true and correct. The application must be accompanied by the proper fee. The application must also provide for the voluntary identification of the applicant as a donor under the provisions of chapter 23-06.2. The application must contain such other information as the director may require.
- 3. Whenever an application is received from a person previously licensed in another jurisdiction, the director may request a copy of the driver's record from such other jurisdiction. When received, the driving record becomes a part of the driving record in this state with the same force and effect as though entered on the driving record in this state in the original instance.
- 4. Whenever the director receives a request for a driving record from another licensing jurisdiction, the record must be forwarded without charge.
- **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-06-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- **39-06-08. Application of minors.** The application of any minor for an instruction instructional permit, a restricted license, or operator's license must be signed and verified before a person authorized to administer oaths or the director's agent, by the father, mother, or legal guardian, or, in the event there is no parent or legal guardian, then by another responsible adult who is willing to assume the obligation imposed under this chapter upon a person signing the application of a minor.

SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

39-06-17. Restricted permits and licenses - Penalty for violation.

- 1. The In addition to the provisions of sections 39-06-04.1 through 39-06-04.6, the director, upon issuing an instructional permit, a restricted license, an operator's license or a temporary restricted operator's license pursuant to section 39-06.1-11, has authority to impose restrictions suitable to the licensee's driving ability with respect to the type of or special mechanical control devices required on a motor vehicle which the permittee or licensee may operate or such other restrictions applicable to the permittee or licensee as the director may determine to be appropriate to assure the safe operation of a motor vehicle by the permittee or licensee.
- The director may either issue a special restricted <u>permit or license</u> or may set forth such restrictions upon the usual <u>permit or license</u> form. The director shall likewise restrict licenses pursuant to the requirements of section 39-16.1-09.
- 3. A <u>Subject to the provisions of sections 39-06-04.1 through 39-06-04.6, a</u> restricted operator's license, a <u>restricted license</u>, or <u>an instructional</u> permit to operate the parent's or <u>legal</u> guardian's automobile, or an automobile which is equipped with dual controls and while accompanied by a qualified instructor, may be issued to any child, who is at least fourteen years of age, and otherwise qualified, upon the written recommendation of the parent or <u>legal</u> guardian. No operator's <u>A restricted</u> license may <u>not</u> be issued until the child, accompanied by the parent or <u>legal</u> guardian, appears in person and satisfies the director that
 - a. The child is at least fourteen years of age.
 - b. The child is qualified to operate an automobile safely.
 - e. It is necessary for the child to drive the parent's or guardian's automobile without being accompanied by an adult.
 - d. The child has completed a course of classroom instruction and a course of behind the wheel instruction acceptable to the director; or, in the alternative, has successfully completed a course at an approved commercial driver

training school the requirements for receiving a restricted license have been met.

The parent or guardian at all times is responsible for any and all damages growing out of the negligent operation of a motor vehicle by any such child. The provisions of this subsection do not authorize the child who is at least fourteen years of age but less than eighteen years of age to drive a commercial truck, motorbus, or taxicab except the holder of a class D restricted license, fourteen or fifteen years of age, may drive a farm motor vehicle having a gross weight of fifty thousand pounds [22679.62 kilograms] when used to transport agricultural products, farm machinery, or farm supplies to or from a farm when so operated within one hundred fifty miles [241.40 kilometers] of the driver's farm.

- 4. The director may upon receiving satisfactory evidence of any violation of the restrictions of such an instructional permit, a restricted license, or operator's license suspend or revoke the same but the permitholder or licensee is entitled to a hearing as upon a suspension or revocation under this chapter.
- 5. It is a class B misdemeanor for any person to operate a motor vehicle in any manner in violation of the restrictions imposed in a restricted license issued to that person. If the restricted license was issued under section 39-06.1-11 and the underlying suspension was imposed for a violation of section 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance, or is governed by chapter 39-20, punishment is as provided in subsection 2 of section 39-06-42 and upon receiving notice of the conviction the director shall revoke, without opportunity for hearing, the licensee's restricted license and shall extend the underlying suspension for a like period of not more than one year. The director may not issue a restricted license for the extended period of suspension imposed under this subsection. If the conviction referred to in this section is reversed by an appellate court, the director shall restore the person to the status held by the person prior to the conviction, including restoration of driving privileges if appropriate.

SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on July 1, 2000.
