1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact sections 39-06-04.1, 39-06-04.2, 39-06-04.3, 39-06-04.4,

2 39-06-04.5, and 39-06-04.6 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a graduated motor

3 vehicle driver licensing program for minors; to amend and reenact sections 39-06-03, 39-06-04,

4 39-06-05, 39-06-07, 39-06-08, subsection 1 of section 39-06-14, and section 39-06-17 of the

5 North Dakota Century Code, relating to a graduated motor vehicle driver licensing program for

6 minors; and to provide an effective date.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9 amended and reenacted as follows:

39-06-03. What persons <u>Persons who</u> may not be licensed. The director may not
issue any license hereunder:

- 12 1. To any person who is under the age of sixteen years, except that the director may 13 issue <u>an instructional permit</u>, a restricted <u>instructional permit</u>, or <u>restricted</u> license 14 <u>as hereinafter provided in under</u> sections <u>39-06-04</u>, 39-06-05, and 39-06-17 to any 15 person who is less than sixteen years of age.
- To any person whose license has been suspended in this state or in any other
 state during such the suspension, except as provided in section 39-06.1-03 or
 39-06.1-11, nor to any person whose license has been revoked, except as
 provided in sections 39-06-35 and 39-06-36.
- To any person who is an habitual drunkard, or is an habitual user of narcotic drugs,
 or is an habitual user of any other drug to a degree which that renders the person
 incapable of safely driving a motor vehicle.

1	4.	To any person who has previously been adjudged to be afflicted with or suffering	
2		from any mental disability or disease and who has not at the time of application	
3		been restored to competency by the methods provided by law.	
4	5.	To any person who is required by this chapter to take an examination, unless such	
5		that person has successfully passed such the examination.	
6	6.	To any person who is required under the laws of this state to deposit security or file	
7		proof of financial responsibility and who has not deposited such the security or	
8		filed such <u>the</u> proof.	
9	7.	To any person when the director has good cause to believe that such the person	
10		by reason of physical or mental disability would not be able to operate a motor	
11		vehicle with safety upon the highways.	
12	8.	To any person when the director has good cause to believe that the operation of a	
13		motor vehicle on the highways by such the person would be inimical to public	
14		safety or welfare.

16	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
17	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:	
18	39-0	06-04. Instruction Instructional permit - Minimum age - Testing. Any person	
19	who is at lea	ast fourteen years of age may apply to the director for obtain an instruction	
20	instructional permit if the person passes a test administered by the director. The director may		
21	issue to the	applicant an instruction instructional permit which entitles the applicant while	
22	having such	permit in the permittee's immediate possession to drive a motor vehicle upon the	
23	public highv	ways for a period of one year when accompanied by a licensed operator who is at	
24	least eighte	en years of age and holds a license corresponding to the vehicle the permittee	
25	operates ar	nd has had at least one year of driving experience and who is occupying a seat	
26	beside the driver. Persons holding an instruction instructional permit for the operation of a		
27	motorcycle	shall operate the motorcycle only during hours when the use of headlights is not	
28	required pu	rsuant to section 39-21-01, and may not carry or transport any passenger. Any	
29	instruction i	nstructional permit may be renewed or a new permit issued for an additional period.	
30	A person w	ho is not yet eighteen years of age is not eligible for a <u>restricted</u> license until that	
31	person has	had an instruction instructional permit issued for at least three six months. The	

1	director ma	y recognize an instruction instructional permit issued by another jurisdiction in	
2	computing the three-month six-month instructional period.		
3	SEC	CTION 3. Six new sections to chapter 39-06 of the North Dakota Century Code are	
4	created and	l enacted as follows:	
5	39-06-04.1. Graduated driver licensing - Instruction and experience. To ensure		
6	that a minor has both instruction and experience before obtaining an operator's license, driving		
7	privileges are granted on an incremental basis in accordance with the following process:		
8	<u>1.</u>	An instructional permit.	
9	<u>2.</u>	A restricted license.	
10	<u>3.</u>	An operator's license.	
11	An instructional permit issued under section 39-06-04 or a restricted license issued under		
12	section 39-0	06-04.3 must have a notation that indicates the level of driving privileges granted by	
13	the permit or license.		
14	<u>39-0</u>	06-04.2. Instructional permit - Restrictions. An instructional permit authorizes	
15	the permith	older to drive the type or class of motor vehicle specified on the permit only under	
16	the followin	g conditions:	
17	<u>1.</u>	The permitholder must be in possession of the permit while operating the motor	
18		vehicle; and	
19	<u>2.</u>	The permitholder may drive only when a supervising driver is seated in the front	
20		seat of the vehicle when it is in motion. No individual other than the supervising	
21		driver and the permitholder may be in the front seat unless the vehicle has only a	
22		front seat, in which case, the supervising driver must be seated next to the	
23		permitholder. A supervising driver must hold a valid operator's license and be at	
24		least eighteen years of age.	
25	<u>39-0</u>	06-04.3. Restricted license - Minimum age. A minor who is at least fourteen	
26	years of ag	e may obtain a restricted license if the minor:	
27	<u>1.</u>	Has held an instructional permit issued by the director for at least six months, and	
28		has:	
29		a. Passed a course of classroom instruction as approved by the superintendent	
30		of public instruction and a course of behind-the-wheel instruction as approved	
31		by the superintendent of public instruction;	

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1		<u>b.</u>	Completed fifty hours of driving with that minor's parent or guardian in
2			compliance with the department rules designed for experience in various day
3			and night driving conditions;
4		<u>C.</u>	Successfully completed a course at a commercial driving training school
5			which has been approved by the superintendent of the state highway patrol
6			pursuant to chapter 39-25; or
7		<u>d.</u>	A combination of classes described in this subsection;
8	<u>2.</u>	Has	s not had a report of a conviction of a traffic offense or admission or
9		<u>adjı</u>	udication of a traffic violation during the preceding six months; and
10	<u>3.</u>	Has	s passed a road test administered by the director.
11	<u>39-</u>	06-04	I.4. Restricted license - Restrictions. A restricted license authorizes the
12	licensehold	ler to	drive the type or class of motor vehicle specified on the restricted license only
13	under the f	ollow	ing conditions:
14	<u>1.</u>	<u>A re</u>	estricted licenseholder must be in possession of the license while operating the
15		mot	tor vehicle;
16	<u>2.</u>	<u>A re</u>	estricted licenseholder may drive without supervision in any of the following
17		<u>circ</u>	umstances:
18		<u>a.</u>	From six a.m. to twelve midnight; or
19		<u>b.</u>	When driving or operating any motor vehicle for the purpose of farming or
20			ranching or for driving directly between work, home, a sanctioned school
21			activity, or a church activity, but may carry passengers only during the hours
22			listed in subdivision a unless accompanied by a supervising driver; and
23	<u>3.</u>	<u>A re</u>	estricted licenseholder may drive at any time when accompanied by a
24		<u>sup</u>	ervising driver who is seated in the front seat of the vehicle when it is in motion.
25		<u>The</u>	e supervising driver need not be the only other occupant of the front seat, but
26		<u>mu:</u>	st be seated next to the licenseholder. A supervising driver must hold a valid
27		mot	or vehicle operator's license and be at least eighteen years of age. An
28		indi	vidual holding a restricted driver's license driving a motor vehicle may not carry
29		mo	re passengers than the vehicle manufacturer's suggested passenger capacity.

1	<u>39-(</u>	06-04.5. Full licensure. A restricted driver's licenseholder who reaches sixteen
2	years of ag	e may obtain an operator's license if the individual's driving privileges are not
3	suspended	or revoked.
4	<u>39-0</u>	06-04.6. Violations. It is unlawful for the holder of an instructional permit or a
5	restricted lie	cense to drive a motor vehicle in violation of the restrictions that apply to the permit
6	or license.	Failure to comply with a restriction concerning the permit or license or the failure to
7	comply with	the supervising driver requirements constitutes operating a motor vehicle without a
8	license. If a	a licenseholder who is under eighteen years of age has a report of a conviction or
9	admission o	or adjudication of a violation of any of the liquor laws in conjunction with the use of a
10	motor vehic	ele, or has accumulated six or more points on that person's driving record during any
11	previous tw	elve consecutive months, the license privilege must be returned to the permit level
12	following co	empletion of any period of suspension or other penalty so imposed.
13	SEC	CTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
14	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:
15	39-0	06-05. Restricted instruction instructional permit - When instruction
16	instruction	al permit not required.
17	1.	The director upon receiving proper application may issue a restricted instruction
18		instructional permit effective for a school year or more restricted period to an
19		applicant who is at least fourteen years of age and enrolled in a commercial driver
20		training course which includes practice driving and which is approved by the
21		superintendent of the highway patrol pursuant to chapter 39-25. Such instruction
22		instructional permit entitles the permittee when the permittee has such a permit in
23		the permittee's immediate possession to operate a motor vehicle only on a
24		designated highway or within a designated area but only when an approved
25		instructor is occupying a seat beside the permittee.
26	2.	Any student who is at least fourteen years of age and enrolled in behind-the-wheel
27		driver's training through a high school program approved by the superintendent of
28		public instruction may operate a motor vehicle, under the supervision of a driver
29		training instructor certified by the superintendent of public instruction, without a
30		permit or license to operate a motor vehicle; provided, that the school district
31		sponsoring the driver's training program has an insurance policy covering any

1		damage which may be done by any such student while operating the vehicle, and
2		provided further that proof of coverage is filed with the superintendent of public
3		instruction by the school district's insurance carrier. The insurance coverage must
4		be in the amount required under section 39-16.1-02.
5	SEC	CTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is
6	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:
7	39-0	06-07. Application for license or instruction instructional permit.
8	1.	Every application for an instruction instructional permit, a restricted license, or for
9		an operator's license must be made upon a form furnished by the director.
10	2.	Every application must state the full name, date of birth, sex, residence and
11		mailing address, and briefly describe the applicant. In signing the application the
12		applicant is deemed to have certified that all information contained on the
13		application is true and correct. The application must be accompanied by the
14		proper fee. The application must also provide for the voluntary identification of the
15		applicant as a donor under the provisions of chapter 23-06.2. The application
16		must contain such other information as the director may require.
17	3.	Whenever an application is received from a person previously licensed in another
18		jurisdiction, the director may request a copy of the driver's record from such other
19		jurisdiction. When received, the driving record becomes a part of the driving
20		record in this state with the same force and effect as though entered on the driving
21		record in this state in the original instance.
22	4.	Whenever the director receives a request for a driving record from another
23		licensing jurisdiction, the record must be forwarded without charge.
24	SEC	CTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
25	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:
26	39-0	06-08. Application of minors. The application of any minor for an instruction
27	instructiona	Il permit, a restricted license, or operator's license must be signed and verified
28	before a pe	rson authorized to administer oaths or the director's agent, by the father, mother, or
29	legal guard	ian, or, in the event there is no parent or legal guardian, then by another responsible
30	adult who is	s willing to assume the obligation imposed under this chapter upon a person signing
31	the applicat	tion of a minor.

SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 39-06-14 of the North Dakota
 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

3 The director, upon payment of a ten dollar fee, shall issue to every qualified 1. 4 applicant for a restricted license under section 39-06-17 an operator's license as 5 applied for in the form prescribed by the director. The license must bear a 6 distinguishing number assigned to the licensee, a color photograph of the licensee, 7 the full name, date of birth, residence address, and a brief description of the 8 licensee, and either a facsimile of the signature of the licensee or a space upon 9 which the licensee shall write the licensee's usual signature. If the licensee is 10 under the age of twenty-one, the photograph must be against a color border or 11 background that is different from the color used for other licensees. If requested 12 on the license application, the license issued by the director must include a 13 statement making an anatomical gift under chapter 23-06.2. No license is valid 14 until it has been signed by the licensee with the licensee's usual signature. The 15 department shall develop a system to require each applicant for an operator's 16 license or renewal of an operator's license to determine whether or not the 17 applicant wishes to be a donor under chapter 23-06.2. For purposes of 18 verification, an officer may require the licensee to write the licensee's signature in 19 the presence of the officer. The director may adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 20 28-32, relating to the manner in which photographs are to be obtained and placed 21 on operator's licenses. The photograph may be produced by digital imaging or 22 other electronic means and is not a public record.

23 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 24 amended and reenacted as follows:

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39-06-17. Restricted licenses - Penalty for violation.

The In addition to the provisions of sections 39-06-04.1 through 39-06-04.6, the
 director, upon issuing an instructional permit, a restricted license, an operator's
 license or a temporary restricted operator's license pursuant to section 39-06.1-11,
 has authority to impose restrictions suitable to the licensee's driving ability with
 respect to the type of or special mechanical control devices required on a motor
 vehicle which the permittee or licensee may operate or such other restrictions

1	applicable to the permittee or licensee as the director may determine to be
2	appropriate to assure the safe operation of a motor vehicle by the permittee or
3	licensee.

- 2. The director may either issue a special restricted <u>permit or</u> license or may set forth
 such restrictions upon the usual <u>permit or</u> license form. The director shall likewise
 restrict licenses pursuant to the requirements of section 39-16.1-09.
- 7 3. A Subject to the provisions of sections 39-06-04.1 through 39-06-04.6, a restricted 8 operator's license, a restricted license, or an instructional permit to operate the 9 parent's or legal guardian's automobile, or an automobile which is equipped with 10 dual controls and while accompanied by a qualified instructor, may be issued to 11 any child, who is at least fourteen years of age, and otherwise qualified, upon the 12 written recommendation of the parent or legal guardian. No operator's A restricted 13 license may not be issued until the child, accompanied by the parent or legal 14 guardian, appears in person and satisfies the director that
- 15 a. The child is at least fourteen years of age.

16 b. The child is qualified to operate an automobile safely.

- 17 c. It is necessary for the child to drive the parent's or guardian's automobile
 18 without being accompanied by an adult.
- 19d.The child has completed a course of classroom instruction and a course of20behind the wheel instruction acceptable to the director; or, in the alternative,21has successfully completed a course at an approved commercial driver22training school the requirements for receiving a restricted license have been23met.
- The parent or guardian at all times is responsible for any and all damages growing out of the negligent operation of a motor vehicle by any such child. The provisions of this subsection do not authorize the child <u>who is at least fourteen years of age</u> <u>but less than sixteen years of age</u> to drive a commercial truck, motorbus, or taxicab except the holder of a class D <u>restricted</u> license, fourteen or fifteen years of age, may drive a farm motor vehicle having a gross weight of fifty thousand pounds [22679.62 kilograms] when used to transport agricultural products, farm

machinery, or farm supplies to or from a farm when so operated within one
 hundred fifty miles [241.40 kilometers] of the driver's farm.

- 4. The director may upon receiving satisfactory evidence of any violation of the
 restrictions of such an instructional permit, a restricted license, or restricted
 operator's license suspend or revoke the same but the permitholder or licensee is
 entitled to a hearing as upon a suspension or revocation under this chapter.
- 7 5. It is a class B misdemeanor for any person to operate a motor vehicle in any 8 manner in violation of the restrictions imposed in a restricted license issued to that 9 person. If the restricted license was issued under section 39-06.1-11 and the 10 underlying suspension was imposed for a violation of section 39-08-01 or 11 equivalent ordinance, or is governed by chapter 39-20, punishment is as provided 12 in subsection 2 of section 39-06-42 and upon receiving notice of the conviction the 13 director shall revoke, without opportunity for hearing, the licensee's restricted 14 license and shall extend the underlying suspension for a like period of not more than one year. The director may not issue a restricted license for the extended 15 16 period of suspension imposed under this subsection. If the conviction referred to 17 in this section is reversed by an appellate court, the director shall restore the 18 person to the status held by the person prior to the conviction, including restoration 19 of driving privileges if appropriate.

20 SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on July 1, 2000.
