## NORTH DAKOTA WORKERS COMPENSATION BUREAU 1999 LEGISLATION SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION

**BILL DESCRIPTION:** Independent Medical Examination

**BILL NO: HB 1264** 

**SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION:** The Workers Compensation Bureau, with the assistance of its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, has reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

The proposed legislation requires the Bureau to notify an injured worker that the injured worker may have a doctor designated by the injured worker present at an independent medical examination. The proposed bill uld also require the Bureau to notify an injured worker that the injured worker may also have a companion esent at the independent medical examination and be allowed to make an audiotape and a videotape of the examination.

FISCAL IMPACT: Not quantifiable. It is anticipated the proposed legislation would result in claims adjudication delays ultimately increasing the costs associated with delays in return to work.
