HB 1281 creates specific bonding authority for an irrigation district finance program and a water supply finance program to be administered by the Water Commission. The bill places a number of obligations on the Water Commission that will increase the workload for present staff, and may require the hiring of consultants to handle the economic feasibility and financial aspects of the program. These costs can be reimbursed by the financing package, if a plan is approved. However, the Water Commission could spend considerable time and money evaluating proposals that do not proceed to implementation. These costs are not included, however, because they are very indeterminate at this time. In addition, this fiscal note does not include any money allocated from the Resources Trust Fund since these funds are part of SB 2023. The only costs included in this fiscal note are an estimate of the administrative costs necessary to set up the programs. These costs could involve outside consultants, Water Commission staff time, attorney fees, or a combination. A very rough estimate is \$25,000 - \$5,000 this biennium, \$15,000 next biennium, and \$5,000 for the 2001-03 biennium.
