Because of the Department's costs for administering the tracking provisions of HB 1332, which would be eliminated with this bill, it is difficult to determine the net fiscal impact of SB 2102. It is likely that the any additional cost to the state of a potentially higher rate of interest on refunds is offset by the reduction in administrative costs associated with the more streamlined provisions of SB 2102.
