Senator Urlacher: Opened the hearing on HB 1076, relating to disclosure of identifying information to the Board of University and School Lands.

Rick Larson: Acting State Land Commissioner, testified in support. Written testimony attached. Senator Urlacher: I'm assuming that this would lessen the procedure to identify people? Rick Larson: Absolutely. Right now the procedure is that if we get a claim, we have to go over to the Tax Dept. to identify the person. There's sometimes a two to three week delay in that process. No we would have it readily available to us and get the money to the people as quickly as possible.

Senator Urlacher: There's about 50% of those claims that are processed?

Rick Larson: Approximately 50% of what is reported to us by the holder is returned to the owner. We have advertising and now an Internet site that people can search to see if their name is on there.

Senator Urlacher: What the size of an average claim

Rick Larson: Last year it was approximately \$800.

Senator Nichols: You wouldn't be listing the social security number with the names

Rick Larson: No. That is something we keep confidential, is it just for purpose of identifying

people.

Senator Nichols: So how would this help you

Rick Larson: They would have to give us a copy of their social security card.

Senator Nichols: So right not you have to go to the Tax Department as a background check to

make certain to make sure that's the correct person

Rick Larson: That is correct.

Senator Stenehjem: What happens in cases of dividends or stock certificates?

<u>Rick Larson</u>: In cases where there is not a social security number, we would require them to show proof that they did business with a company.

Senator Stenehjem: Do you hold these stocks in your account forever until someone claims them? What happens with the dividends and the interest that's carned on those stocks?

Rick Larson: The stocks are held for a period of time before they are sold. The dividends that are received in the meantime benefit the common school's trust fund.

Senator Stenehjem: So you don't hold the dividends and interest for the owner?

Rick Larson: That is correct.

Senator Christmann: If you've got some kind of unclaimed property for an individual, are you wanting the Tax Commissioner to provide you with the social security number and other information to help you find that person? Or is this just for if that person happens to show up at your door with their social security card, you can check to make sure it's the right person?

<u>Rick Larson</u>: It is a means of identifying the person that comes into us. It isn't a means of finding people.

Senator Christmann: This would just affect tax refunds that aren't sent out?

Rick Larson: That's correct.

<u>Senator Nichols</u>: The checks that are turned over, do you clear those and then collect some interest on them for expenses?

Rick Larson: In the meantime they're earning income for the common schools.

Senator Stenehjem: So when someone claims the check, they don't get the interest?

Rick Larson: That's correct.

Donnita Wald: State Tax Dept., testified neutrally. The Tax Dept. has no problem with the bill.

What the Unclaimed Property Division gets is a list from the Treasurer's Office with the taxpayer's name, address, check number, and the date the check was issued, and the amount of the check. There's no social security number on that list. That's where the Land Dept. wants to be able to ask for the social security number.

Senator Christmann: The Tax Dept. has no problem with some kind of ethical dilemma that you're providing an ID number outside of your department.

Donnita Wald: No. Our goal is to try to get the taxpayers their money back.

Senator Urlacher: Closed the hearing.

Discussion followed. Concerns expressed about people not getting interest, how hard people are looked for, and the release of the social security number.

House Bill 1076 is introduced for the purpose of providing a confidentiality exemption for the ND State Tax Department, which would allow the Department to include social security numbers and federal employer identification numbers in its annual listing of unclaimed property owners. We understand the personal nature of this information, and need to state up front that it would be used solely for identification and matching purposes, and would not be publicized in any manner by the Unclaimed Property Division.

The burden of proof of ownership of unclaimed property is on the rightful owner. Unfortunately, it is not unusual for property to be reported without any information we can use to make a positive match. In many instances, we receive property in the name of John Doe, with no last-known address, or social security number. Because more than one person may have the same name, in the interest of the rightful owner, we cannot approve claims simply on a same-name basis. Therefore, without documentation showing the exact dollar amount of the claim, an owner is often unable to recover their property.

Approval of this proposed legislation would allow us to implement changes in reporting procedures that would give us access to information the Tax Department has readily available. In the past five years we have received nearly 800 properties from the ND State Tax Department.
