Chairman Klein: How we'll open the hearing on HB1156, and take the testimony in favor.

Chuck Lang: (Office of Management and Budget) Refer to attached testimony and amendment.

Chairman Klein: It seems to me, we passed a bill similar to this last session.

Lang: I think the bill you're referring to is probably Section 1 of this bill, which says, if we had an agreement with another state to bypass the sales tax, then we could pay them.

Chairman Klein: So this one expands on it to refer to travel agencies and complete packages and so on.

Rep. Bellew: Does this just have to do with out of state travel?

Lang: Yes, because in ND, we probably aren't going to get combination packages or some kind of a deal. An example would be a World Perk's Vacation package, and there, you buy your airfare and your lodging, and you get a substantial break on your airfare and your lodging.

Rep. Devlin: What percentage of out of state travel is done with travel agencies?

Lang: I don't really know, I would guess that a substantial part is booked through a travel agency.

Rep. Devlin: Would the employees have the option of going to any travel agency they would like, or is there a travel agency that has a state bid?

Lang: They would have their choice of where they booked their travel.

Rep. Hunsaker: If this is passed, is there a saving of time and effort on the side of the state?

Lang: I think it might, but I don't know if it does a lot, because we have to have something to pay anyway, there has to be some kind of invoice. I think probably it will alleviate some of the paperwork the employee has to do. Most of the time, I would guess, they would have one person in their office making these arrangements, dealing with these travel agencies.

Rep. Haas: Is there a separate statute that would cover political subdivisions for this same type of thing, because I know school districts have been doing this for a long period of time.

Lang: I don't know.

Chairman Klein: Any other questions? With no further testimony on HB1156, we'll close the hearing. In HB1156, the amendment was brought in last session, and this amendment modifies it and makes it more useful. Discussion.

Rep. Grande: I move we pass the amendment

Rep. Kasper: Second

Chairman Klein: Discussion on the amendment

Rep. Brusegaard: I have a small concern about the state contracting for services. It would be tough to coordinate among all the state agencies, and I understand that, but this is the way special consideration to private businesses gets started. I'm not sure how to fix it, I'm not sure it can be fixed.

Chairman Klein: I can understand, but I think you also need to understand that someone from Williston is traveling and he has to use a travel agent from Fargo. It's probably a little harder to do.

Rep. Kasper: There's also the situation where travel agent's specials are fluid. I like the flexibility of being able to choose.

Rep. Cleary: I agree, I find more of a problem having one agency do it. Everything changes so often.

Chairman Klein: Now we'll take up the amendment on the voice vote. All in favor say 'ay'.
Are we ready to act on the bill?

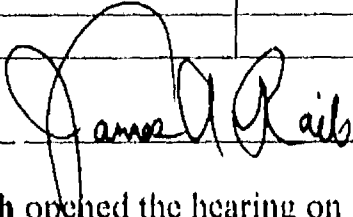

Minutes: **Chairman Krebsbach** opened the hearing on HB 1156 which relates to the direct billing of employee lodging expenses. **Chuck Lang** representing the office of Management and Budget presented written testimony to the committee. A copy of his testimony is attached. **Senator Dever** inquired why something like this has to be necessary to be in code. **Mr. Lang** indicated the reason is it is in code now, the employees would be reimbursed. This bill allows OMB to by pass what is in code. **Senator T. Mathern** inquired what happens in this situation where you make a prearrangement and then there is sickness or something else comes up and the employee can't go. He supposes that is one of the dangers here. He knows from personal experience when he makes a prearrangement there is usually a penalty to make a change. How do we handle penalties under a deal like this? **Mr. Lang** indicated that will happen but he thinks a lot of times the amount of times that does happen compare to amount of times you save money is insignificant. Sometimes you can pay a surcharge and you can use like an airline ticket at a later date. The same rules would apply. **Senator Dever** inquired if we had a central travel

agency in the state that makes those kind of arrangements for people. **Mr. Lang** indicated at one time there was but it didn't work that well so it only lasted about a biennium. Mr. Chairman, Members of the Committee;

My name is Chuck Lang with the Office of Management and Budget and I am here to introduce HB1156, which deals with the direct billing of employee lodging expense.

The proposed legislation adds section 2 to NDCC 44-08-04.5. The purpose for the legislation is to allow the state to recognize cost savings when purchasing out-of-state lodging as a package with other travel related expenses such as airfare. The bill permits the state to prepay employee lodging and to pay the lodging facility or travel agency directly if it results in cost savings to the state. Currently, employee lodging expense is reimbursed to the employee after submitting a travel voucher with proper lodging receipts and supervisor approval.

At this time I would like to introduce an amendment that allows payments to be made to either a lodging provider or travel agency. The current version of the bill only allows payment to a lodging provider. If a combination airfare-lodging package were to be purchased, a travel agency would probably be used rather than a lodging provider.
