TESTIMONY OF LAVERNE REINBOLD LICENSING ADMINISTRATOR OFFICE OF ATTORNEY GENERAL

CONCERNING HOUSE BILL NO. 1159 BEFORE THE HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE JANUARY 10, 2001

In the 1991 Legislative Session, N.D.C.C. § 43-31-14 was amended to raise the Detection of Deception Examiners (Polygraph) license fee from \$25 to \$35. At that time, the fees required for licensure by reciprocity (N.D.C.C. § 43-31-16) were overlooked, and thus remained at \$25.

This bill, if passed, will make the license fees the same for all detection of deception licensure.

Reciprocity is established with another State if it is determined that State's detection of deception law is equal to or greater than North Dakota's law. At this time, North Dakota has established reciprocity with six states; they are: California, Illinois, Kentucky, South Dakota, Texas, and Utah.

For your review, I have attached copies of N.D.C.C. §§ 43-31-14 and 43-31-16 of the current law with this testimony.

5 43-31-14. Examination and license fees

- 1. The fee to be paid by an applicant for examination to determine his fitness to receive an examiner's license is fifty dollars.
- The annual license fee is thirty-five dollars, and is due and payable on or before October first of each year. A reinstatement fee of fifty dollars is required in addition to the annual license fee for each license renewal applied for after September thirtieth.
- 3. The fee to be paid for the issuance of a duplicate license is five dollars.
- 4. The fee to be paid for an internship license, and for the extension or renewal thereof, is twenty-five dollars.

§ 43-31-16. Examiner licensed in another state exempt from examination

An applicant who is an examiner, licensed under the laws of another state of the United States, may be issued a license without examination by the attorney general, in his discretion, upon payment of a fee of twenty-five dollars, and the production of satisfactory proof:

- 1. That the applicant is at least twenty-one years of age;
- 2. That the applicant is a citizen of the United States;
- 3. That he is of good moral character;
- 4. That the requirements for the licensing of examiners in such particular state of the United States were at the date of licensing, substantially equivalent to the requirements then in force in this state; and
- 5. That the applicant had lawfully engaged in the administration of polygraph examinations under the laws of such state for at least two years prior to his application for license hereunder.
