Minutes: Senator Traynor, opened the hearing on HB 1205.

Rep. Klemin, testified in favor of HB 1205 (testimony attached). Bill brings statute into line with current pretrial and trial practice in courts.

Senator Traynor, comment on the 15 days.

Rep. Klemin, the 15 days applies only if you are party of record.

Senator Traynor, has there been a problem?

Rep. Klemin, don't know if there has been a problem. I had to argue to the supreme court during the last session. This would help alleviate this problem. Some trial attorneys are very aggressive. Was subpoenaed for an oral argument and also had to appear at a trail in Fargo at the same time. The attorney in Fargo would not release me from appearing. Now the statute reads "only for trials."

Senator Watne, shouldn't there be a coeval in here if a delay would be detrimental to a party.

I'm also a Realtor, I take 3 months off to work shouldn't this apply to other occupations also?

TESTIMONY OF REP. LAWRENCE R. KLEMIN SENATE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE HOUSE BILL NO. 1205 MARCH 12, 2001

MR. CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE SENATE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE. I AM LAWRENCE R. KLEMIN, REPRESENTATIVE FROM DISTRICT 47 IN BISMARCK. I AM HERE TO TESTIFY IN SUPPORT OF HOUSE BILL 1205.

HOUSE BILL 1205 UPDATES SECTION 54-03-22 OF THE NORTH DAKOTA CENTURY CODE AND PERMITS A LEGISLATOR TO REQUEST AN EXTENSION OF TIME OR A CONTINUANCE IN A CIVIL ACTION DURING THE LEGISLATIVE SESSION WHEN A LEGISLATOR IS EITHER A PARTY, A WITNESS OR THE ATTORNEY FOR A PARTY IN THE CIVIL ACTION.

THE BILL DELETES OBSOLETE LANGUAGE IN THE EXISTING LAW AND BRINGS THE STATUTE UP TO DATE AND INTO LINE WITH CURRENT PRETRIAL AND TRIAL PRACTICE IN THE COURTS. DURING THE LEGISLATIVE SESSION, A LEGISLATOR IS ENTITLED TO A CONTINUANCE OF ANY MATTER RELATED TO THE CIVIL ACTION WHICH WOULD REQUIRE THE PRESENCE OF THE LEGISLATOR, SUCH AS DEPOSITIONS, HEARINGS AND TRIALS. A LEGISLATOR OBTAINS A CONTINUANCE SIMPLY BY FILING A SHORT MOTION AND AFFIDAVIT STATING THAT THE PERSON IS A MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY AND THAT THE LEGISLATURE IS IN SESSION. THE BILL ALSO APPLIES TO APPEARANCES IN PROCEEDINGS BEFORE ADMINISTRATIVE AGENCIES AND LOCAL GOVERNING BODIES WHILE THE LEGISLATURE IS IN SESSION.

THE BILL IS PERMISSIVE. A LEGISLATOR MAY EITHER ATTEND THE CIVIL PROCEEDING, OR NOT, IN THE DISCRETION OF THE LEGISLATOR. HOWEVER, A LEGISLATOR IS ELECTED TO REPRESENT CONSTITUENTS IN THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY DURING THE SESSION AND MATTER RELATING TO A CIVIL ACTION CAN BE CONTINUED FOR A SHORT TIME UNTIL THE SESSION IS OVER.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE, I URGE YOUR SUPPORT OF HOUSE BILL 1205.
