1A:448 CHAIRMAN NICHOLAS: We will now open the Hearing on 11B 1258.

REPRESENTATIVE MONSON: The Bill that you have before you is intro ducted on behalf the Conola growers around the state. The acreage has increased tremendously. Staying in the conola has kept me in the farming business. It has been making money for me. The conola industry has really taken off. This Bill will change the membership of the oil seed council to include three conola producers. Section two actually splits the state up into three conola districts. Please see the Bill as to the districts. There will be a representative from each district. Each district has roughly the same acreage in their districts.

The conola acreage has increased to the point where it is about the same as sunflowers.

This will even out the membership. Of the oil seed council.

REPRESENTATIVE PIETCH: This will be a ten member board then?

REPRESENTATIVE MONSON: The total number of people on the board will not be changed.

There really never counted as to how many board members there are. Excuse me, there are two extra ones.

There is one change to the Bill that we have asked for is that the length of the term was three years and we had a maximum of three terms allowable under the present Bill. 
