REP, M, KLEIN called the hearing to order, with all committee members present.

In favor:

REP, ARLO E. SCHMIDT, DISTRICT 12

REP. SCHMIDT introduces the bill to the committee.

REP, BELLEW asks if the flags would be flown at the same level as the United States flag.

REP. SCHMIDT was not sure.

In favor:

SEN, MICHAEL A, EVERY, DISTRICT 12

SEN, EVERY speaks on behalf of the bill also, and urges the committee a do pass.

In favor:

REP, RODNEY J. FROELICH, DISTRICT 35

REP. FROELICH is also one of the sponsors on the bill. REP. FORELICH comments to the committee that there are over 60,000 Native Americans enrolled in this state. REP. FROELICH asks the committee to amend the bill to have the flags flown outside, not to be inside as was originally thought. The flags are asked to be flown out front along with the United States flag.

REP. M. KLEIN asks if they are asking for four poles. REP. FROELICH replies that it may possibly be five poles. REP. BELLEW asks if the flags will be flown at the same level as the United States flag? REP. FROELICH replies that maybe a lower degree than the US flag. In favor:

SEN. JOEL C. HEITKAMP, DISTRICT 27

SEN. HEITKAMP apologizes to the committee that he does not have the amendments already made up and ready to hand out to the committee. SEN. HEITKAMP comments to the committee that the flags are wished to be flown outside. He will bring the amendments down as soon as he gets them. This is a wonderful sign to give to the people. The Capitol grounds commission will decide where to put the flag poles.

REP. KLEMIN asks if this would be left up to the grounds commission? <u>SEN. HEITKAMP</u> replies that yes, it almost has to, that's their job.

In favor:

SEN, DENNIS BERCIER, DISTRICT 9

SEN, BERCIER states that there is equity in the Indian Nations, SEN, BERCIER comments to the committee that he is a Vietnam veteran. Right now there are four federally recognized tribes.

SEN, BERCIER states to the committee that it will cost on an average about \$10,000.00 a pole.

SEN, BERCIER asks the committee to please pass this legislation.

ZIMMERMAN has seen the fiscal note. There generally is no uniform size to the flags.

ZIMMERMAN comments that \$10,000.00 is probably correct for each pole. There are 9 people on the commission.

Being there was no further testimony in favor or in opposition, the hearing was then closed.

Representative Klein:

I have been asked to review and comment on an amenument to House Bill 1355. The amendment that has been offer may have a fiscal impact:

1. For flag poles installed on the Capitol Grounds I would expect the cost range from \$7,500 per pole to \$12,500 d the type of pole, the location of the installation and the underground wiring costs for each pole.

- 2. The cost for flags will be difficult to determine because the uniqueness of some ethnic flags may make them a the present time we spend approximately \$48 per North Dakota flag. I have not been able to get a definitive—price o Indian Commission, and it would be even more difficult to estimate other ethnic flags if we—don't know who would their flags on the Capitol Grounds. The flags do need to be replaced about—four times per year so if an ethnic flag anticipate an annual expense of \$400 per year per flag pole.—Again, I have no definitive way at this point in time to derequests the planning commission would approve—and the cost for each ethnic flag.
- 3. We estimate that the cost to burn a 300 watt flag pole light 12 hours a day year round would cost about \$59 pe Using the above information I would expect an annual cost to the state to be about \$450 per year per flag pole plus the I would be happy to meet with you if I can be of any further assistance.
