This bill requests that the physician, nurse midwife, nurse practitioner, or other individual attending a newborn infant shall provide the parent with a referral to have a hearing test within thirty days. Any hearing impariment shall be reported to the Health Department as described. Together with the Childrens Special Health Services in the Department of Human Services, a brochure on infant hearing impairment would be developed or purchased and distributed to health care providers and state residents regarding the need for early detection of hearing impairments, treatments, and government services available to this population. The costs for this service will be very minimal and will be obsorbed in our existing budget.
