Minutes: Chairman DeKrey opened the hearing on HB 1475. Relating to prohibited acts in correctional facilities and to provide a penalty.

Rep Kroeber: District 48, James town (see attached testimony)

Marcie Coney Fisher: from the County Correctional Facility in James town. The main purpose for us in this bill, we have outlawed tobacco. Smuggling eigarettes are the main concern. This has become the drug of choice in our institution. It is causing a hazard in the facility, because we don't supply matches anymore. They are using metal, or electrical outlets for a spark, it causes all kinds of problems. By bringing the penalty in line, we are hoping this will help with the problem.

Rep Eckre: What is the class B penalty?

Marcie Fisher: IT is 30 days or up to \$1,000.00.

Rep Eckre: If someone is already serving time, what do you do, add it on?

Marcie Fisher: We would charge them in court, and they would have another charge and receive the penalty.

Rep Eckre: For eigarettes.

Marcie Fisher: Yes.

Rep Klemin: It would be a trial by jury.

Marcie Fisher: Correct.

Marcie Fisher: Yes, we do, from surrounding counties and state and federal prisoners.

Marcie Fisher: Correct.

Rep Delmore: What is a shard.

Marcie Fisher: It is a home made knife.

Rep Klemin: Do I understand that all penalties are the same?

Marcie Fisher: Correct.

Minutes: Senator Traynor, opened the hearing on 1475.

Rep. Kroeber, district 48, (testimony attached) supports the bill.

Senator Traynor, is there any instance of our law where possession of tobacco could be a crime?

Senator Watne, my understanding is that these prisoners can get outside, can't they smoke then? Marice Conly Fisher, bringing the bill to coincide with contraband laws. Tobacco is one of our leading problems in the jails. We want to make it against the law to smoke in prison. They are not allowed to smoke outside in recreation areas because we consider that to be within the facility.

Senator Trenbeath, they have internal means to deter smoking in the penitentiary.

Senator Dever, in subsection 4, can a guest bring a smoke into the prison?

Senator Trenbeath, is this state law or a policy? And you want us to make it a crime it a crime to break your policy?

Senator Dever, if we make it a crime doesn't it need to go back to the court?

Ken Sørenson, assistant Attorney General, council for the department of corrections, this bill parallels SB 2133. We are dealing with this because a visitor tried to smuggle meth into the prison. Bill includes provisions on weapons as well.
