Minutes: Rep. Weisz. - Chairman opened the hearing on HCR 3032; A concurrent resolution urging the director the of the Department of Transportation place into the state highway system the route from the South Dakota border through Venturia, Ashley, and Lehr to Interstate 94.

Rep. Kretschmar: For the record he is a state representative from the 28th District Pt. Of Dickey. Emmons, Logan, McIntosh and, Pt. Of LaMoure counties. I sponsored this bill for many of the people of my District. I do not consider this a requirement or a mandate to the DOT to do anything. I do want the DOT to think about it because the people of my area would love to the have their towns served with a state highway. And it is a part of this to shift some of the burden of the maintainance to the department. These communities need to be served by black top roads and the cost of maintaining all this mileage is a burden for the counties. I would have no problem if the committee wanted to amend this resolution adding other sections of roads to the state highway system.

Rep. Mahoney: (5007) The state highway system is limited in the number of mile it can have --

my information from Mr. Freier they are at that limit -- do you see that being changed here?

Rep. Kretschmar: In visiting with Tom Freier, it is supposedly in our the state highway system is limited to 7700 mile and they are not there yet. They want kind of a cushion he said there are a couple of hundred miles they could add. Of course the legislature could always change that number.

Rep. Schmidt: (5232) I would like to sign in and testify for this bill because I can show you a section of Highway 30 that should be included in the state highway system. Rep. Schmidt then made his case for that section of road north of Maddock north of York to Wolford which would provide continuity to State Highway 30.

Rep. Ruby: (5692) Are not parts of Hwy. 30 in the state highway system and are you having a problems with the parts that are?

Rep. Schmidt: No -- where I live the state maintains it but that other part is not maintained by the state and it needs to be upgraded and signed.

Tim Horner: I am Director of Traffic Services for the DOT. We certainly are not here to testify in opposition to this bill. We are here to answer questions.

HCR 3032

HCR 3032 urges the department director to add miles to the state highway system: from the South Dakota border to N.D. 11 and north to N.D. 13 through Ashley; from the Cross Ranch State Park to N.D. 200A; and from U.S. 2 near York to N.D. 17.

We appreciate that the cities, counties, and townships, like the department, are faced with the financial challenges of maintaining and improving their road and street systems. North Dakota has a large road network with a small population base to support it. All jurisdictions face similar problems and challenges.

Periodically, the department receives requests to add mileage to the state system. In the 1970s and early 1980s we added miles, but since the mid-1980s we've added very little. Section 24-01-01.2 of the N.D.C.C. limits the size of the state highway system to seven percent of the entire roadway mileage in the state, and says that in no case may the state system exceed 7,700 miles. Currently, there are 7,378 miles on the state system.

An existing process is in place to help us make decisions about additions to the state highway system. The department handles each request on an individual basis, analyzing the function of the roadway, existing and projected traffic volumes, traffic generators of regional or statewide significance, continuity and spacing of routes, the condition of the roadway, and the possibility of removing a segment from the state system if one is added. After analyzing all of the pertinent facts, the Director determines whether it is in the state's best interest to add the miles to the state system.

Our policy on additions to the state system requires the local jurisdiction to build up the roadway to state standards before it is added to the state system, after which we surface it. It would cost about \$460,000 per mile to reconstruct and surface the roadways addressed in this resolution.

Last Friday, Governor Hoeven announced that the department will be the lead agency in developing a Statewide Strategic Transportation Plan to include all jurisdictions and modes of transportation. In addition, we're required to update our transportation plan every five years, and are currently doing so. These efforts will include performing system reviews that look at the various roadway functions.

The department opposes HCR 3032 because there is a process in place for analyzing and evaluating requests for adding mileage to the state highway system.
