Chairman Price: Open hearing on HCR 3054.

Rep. Devlin: Presented bill. HCR 3054 grew out of a bill that the committee had earlier. We voted down after discussions with the Attorney General's Office and some legal people who deal with child support issues. We might have disrupted more than we wanted to, legally, in the areas of child custody and visitation. We thought perhaps a study resolution would be a more appropriate way of looking at that. Most of us that dealt with child support visitation terms, including custody, have thought often that these terms were more in mind of somebody dealing with prisoners than they are dealing with children, and made them sound like possessions more than individuals that are the responsibility of both parents. I would hope that we would move

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this resolution forward with a DO PASS and, hopefully, the Legislative Council would chose it because I think it is an area we need to deal with. A lot of states have went to this already. From every indication we have as worked very well for them.
