Minutes:

**REP. AL CARLSON, CHAIRMAN** Opened the hearing.

**REP. ED LLOYD, DIST. 19, GRAND FORKS COUNTY,** Introduced the resolution as the prime sponsor. This resolution replaces HB 1432. HB 1432, covered the shift of taxes from property funding K - 12 education, to income and sales tax. The bill was defeated. The real impotence of this, is on line 13 through 15. That is the consideration of a change in tax policy. The intent is to understand whether we will need to make a total shift like Michigan or Ohio have done with all of their taxes, in order to develop a better system. That would include HCR 3055.

**REP. DROYDAL** Stated we may have to recind the authority which allows cities to levy their own sales tax, will this resolution answer that question?

**REP. LLOYD** Stated he didn't know, he said, he wasn't the only one to ask that question. If we go the route of Michigan, that would be a part of the whole program. The legislature in Michigan developed a proposal which they were going to bring to the public. At the same time,

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the study committee developed a proposal which they put on the ballot, and the people voted for the study committee before the legislature bill became enacted, so the bill died.

**REP. CARLSON** Stated we need to look at the whole picture or you could create inequity by trying to create equity. He thought there will be two or three studies before this is done.

**REP. DROVDAL** Made a motion for a **DO PASS**

**REP. HERBEL** Second the motion. **MOTION CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE AND**

**WILL BE PLACED ON THE CONSENT CALENDAR.**

Senator Urlacher: Opened the hearing on HCR 3060, directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability of providing school district property tax relief and replacement of revenues through state funding.

Senator Christmann absent from the hearing.

Representative Al Carlson: Co-sponsored the bill, testified in support. We killed a bill in the House that dealt with the funding of education, and the burden that it places on property tax relief. That bill had a \$450 million fiscal note. The bill failed so I signed on this study that deals with the issue of looking at alternatives for replacement of revenues for property tax. That's why it's before you in the form of a resolution. We feel it's worthy of studying.

Senator Urlacher: In general, there's talk about looking at the whole tax structure and I think we have enough resolutions to cover the whole structure, this being one of them
