Minutes:SB 2209 relating to a motor vehicle excise tax exemption for a motor vehicle acquired or leased by a a resident who was a prisoner of war; and to provide an effective date.

Senator Bercier: (District 9; Supports) States that he is a veteran of war and supports the bill.

There aren't that many POW's and this would be an honorable thing to do. Most are elderly and have suffered extreme conditions

Rep. Aarsvold: (District 20; Supports) See attached testimony.

Senator Lyson: (District 1; Supports) See attached amendment.

Rep. Byerly: (District 1; Supports) Supports this bill.

**Bob Hanson**: (ND Veteran's Coordinating Counsel; Supports) This bill comes about because of misunderstanding of how it was administered in about 1980. Up until March, POW's had been exempt from motor vehicle excise tax. It was found out that this is not allowed, so we would like to reinstate their rights.

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Senator Trenbeath: (Wants record to note that he is a former Captain of US Army Air Defense Artillary) Why aren't we writing this the same as the Disabled Veteran's?

**Bob Hanson**: In Disabled Veteran's, it states that you only get one plate. You only get one plate for POW, so it's the same.

Ernest Sands: (POW; Supports) Supports bill.

Persing Carlson: (WWII Veteran; Supports) Supports bill.

Keith Kiser: (NDDOT; Neutral) Gives background of bill Special license plates for POW's enacted in 1981 for Disabled American Veteran's. Eligible for one plate. Turns out, after stricter look at law, they would not be able to honor vehicle tax exemption.

Senator O'Connell: Why is there no \$ amount in fiscal note and what is the number of plates issued?

Keith Kiser: We have not been collecting taxes so that's why there's no fiscal note. So far we've issued 125-130 plates.

Senator Stenehjem: Is there a yearly registration fee?

Keith Kiser: Yes, a \$5 annual registration fee.

Hearing closed.

Committee reopened on 2-8-01.

Senator Trenbeath makes a motion to move the amendment. Seconded by Senator Espegard. Roll Call taken 5-1-0. Senator Trenbeath made a motion to Do Pass as amended. Seconded by Senator O' Connell. Roll Call taken 5-1-0. Carrier is Senator Espegard.

This bill enacts a specific motor vehicle excise tax exemption for former prisoners of war. Based on an administrative policy enacted by a former Motor Vehicle Registrar and a memorandum from the Office of the Attorney General, we have been granting a tax exemption for these vehicles since 1981.

Minutes: Rep. Pollert - Vice Chairman opened the hearing on SB 2209; A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 57-40.3-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a motor vehicle excise tax exemption for a motor vehicle acquired or leased by a resident who was a prisoner of war; and to declare an emergency.

Rep. Aarsvold: (3126) I represent District 20. I have distributed a copy of my testimony. A copy of his testimony is attached.

Rep. Hawken: (3316) What are we talking about numbers wise in the state of North Dakota?

Rep. Aarsvold: May I refer your question to Mr. Hanson who has those facts and he will be testifying.

Rep. Price: (3355) Is this for their personal vehicle or if they are a business man can it be for a whole?

Rep. Aarsvold: Up to 2 personal vehicles.

Rep. Price: (3410) Two vehicles in a lifetime or two vehicles per year or two vehicle ---?

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Rep. Aarsvold: Two vehicles concurrently.

Sen. Stan Lyson: I am Senator for District 1 in Williston. I am not going to talk long because has all been said. I do want correct the previous speaker. It is one vehicle. I think we owe people Who have served our country in this manner at least this much and I support SB 2209.

Rep. Grumbo: (3573) What is this -- is it something we have done before?

Sen. Lyson: Yes -- we have been doing this forever. But it was last February when they discovered we didn't have law in place to do it.

Rep. Ruby: (3637) Reading the fiscal note here it says it was based on an administrative policy And won't change anything but make it legal?

Sen. Lyson: Yes we have been do this since 1981.

Pershing Carlson: I am Department Commander of the Prisoners of War Association. I appear on behalf of a number of prisoners of war in support of this bill. We appreciate your support of this Because we were shocked when we get this letter from the DOT advising this was not legal.

There are currently about 120 - 125 plates being issued.

Rep. Thorpe: (3933) We should probably put an emergency clause on this bill.

Sen. Bercier: I am State Senator from District 9. I am also a Viet Nam veteran. I am in support of SB 2209.

Bob Hanson: I am a member of the North Dakota Veterans Coordinating Council and its legislative committee. I am appearing in support of SB 2209. The Council is an organization of all five of the veterans organizations -- the American Legion, the Disabled American Veterans,

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Veterans of Foreign Wars, Viet Nam Veterans of America and we represent all these organizations. We are unanimous in our support of SB 2209.

Rep. Carlson: (4433) We are all aware of the prisoners of war from World II but do we have veterans who were prisoners in the Korean War and Viet Nam in this state -- what is the number if you have it?

Bob Hanson: There are some from Korea -- Viet Nam had only 1 and that person has left to sate or died. That's all I am aware of and I do not know exact numbers.

Keith Kiser: I am Director of the Motor Vehicle division of the DOT. We support this bill.

Rep. Schmidt: (4886) How do we have a Lewis and Clark and to do this we need a special law to do this.

Keith Kiser: There was a special law passed to authorize the Lewis and Clark plates.

Rep. Schmidt: (4952) I thought that bill failed 95 - 0.

Keith Kiser: I am not sure of the history of that but by the end of the session last time there was a bill passed authorizing the Lewis and Clark plates.

Rep. Price: (5032) Rep. Schmidt -- we killed the bill on a new issue for all license plates but we did allow people to request and pay for the new Lewis and Clark plates.

Rep. Mahoney: (5076) Has anybody gotten caught on this after the DOT issued their letter? Keith Kiser: Nobody that we are aware of.

Rep. Pollert - Vice Chairman there being no one else wishing to appear to testify for or against SB 2209 we will close the hearing on SB 2209. (5277)

Rep. Mahoney: (5281) I move a 'Do Pass' on SB 2209.

Rep. Hawken: (5285) I second the motion.

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On a roll call vote the motion carried: 13 yeas 0 nays 1 absent.

Rep. Thoreson was designated to carry SB 2209 on the floor.

# Senate Transportation Committee Testimony Prepared by Representative Aarsvold Senate Bill 2209 January 25, 2001

I appear before you as a co-sponsor of Senate Bill 2209 and represent concerns expressed to me over the past several months by former prisoners of war, individual veterans, and veterans' organizations in my district.

I understand there is a need to clarify the law regarding the automobile use tax exemption for disabled American military veterans and former prisoners of war. Senate Bill 2209 would resolve that situation as it affects former prisoners of war. Representative Pietsch has a companion bill (House Bill 1325) in the House that addresses the disabled veterans' issue. I am a co-sponsor of that effort as well.

I solicit the Committee's endorsement of Senate Bill 2209. It provides a modest tax benefit for those veterans who endured the hardship of incarceration by enemies of our way of life. Their physical and emotional suffering demands this small acknowledgment and much, much more.

# HOUSE TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE PREPARED BY REPRESENTATIVE OLE AARSVOLD DISTRICT 20 SENATE BILL 2209 MARCH 2, 2001

I APPEAR BEFORE YOU AS A COSPONSOR OF SENATE BILL 2209, AND REPRESENT CONCERNS EXPRESSED TO ME OVER THE PAST SEVERAL MONTHS BY FORMER PRISONERS OF WAR, INDIVIDUAL VETERANS, AND VETERANS' ORGANIZATIONS IN MY DISTRICT.

I UNDERSTAND THERE IS A NEED TO CLARIFY THE LAW REGARDING THE MOTOR VEHICLE TAX EXEMPTION FOR DISABLED AMERICAN MILITARY VETERANS AND FORMER PRISONERS OF WAR. REPRESENTATIVE PIETSCH HAS A COMPANION BILL (HOUSE BILL 1325) IN THE SENATE THAT ADDRESSES THE DISABLED VETERANS' ISSUE. I AM A COSPONSOR OF THAT EFFORT AS WELL.

I SOLICIT THE COMMITTEE'S ENDORSEMENT OF SENATE BILL 2209. IT
PROVIDES A MODEST TAX BENEFIT FOR THOSE VETERANS WHO ENDURED THE
HARDSHIP OF INCARCERATION BY ENEMIES OF OUR WAY OF LIFE. THEIR
PHYSICAL AND EMOTIONAL SUFFERING DEMANDS THIS SMALL
ACKNOWLEDGMENT AND MUCH, MUCH MORE.
