Minutes: Chairman DeKrey opened the hearing on SB 2257. Relating to possession of a firearm at a public gathering.

Rep Porter: District 34 This bill came by way of a problem that would not allow him to carry a concealed weapon in places where he has to do business. When he had a threat against his life, he felt he was unprotected. It was felt that as a retired judge that he should be able to carry a weapon if he met the training requirements. There is a difference between a retired law officer and a retired judge. This bill would cover a retired law officer who retires in the system. The training requirement remains the same as a law enforcement officer.

Rep Eckre: On line nine it states, or sporting events. What about turkey shoots.

Rep Porter: That is the current law for concealed weapon permits, and the reason that is in there Is to keep people from going to a high school football game and carrying a concealed weapon, it has nothing to do with shooting events.

Rep Delmore: Any of these people can come into my school or church with a concealed weapon.

Rep Porter: Any of these people, yes if they are certified/

Rep Delmore: what is the level of training.

Rep Porter: I am going to defer that to Senator Lyson.

Vie Chr Kretschmar: What is the reason that the supreme court is left out.

Rep Porter: We were on short notice and didn't know about the justices, we can amend them back in.

Rep Mahoney: Municipal court judges of small town, they are not law trained, but they would have to maintain the same level of a police officer. Doesn't that go beyond concealed weapons requirement.

Rep Porter: That is the point of the bill, if they want to carry a concealed weapon, they would have the same training level and competency level as a police officer and in compliance with the local authorities.

Rep Klemin: Why would a retired North Dakota law enforcement officer would want to carry a concealed weapon.

Rep Porter: I will defer to Senator Lyson.

Rep Onstad: Who will monitor them that they stay current.

Rep Porter: The Attorney General's Office.

Chairman DeKrey: If there are no questions, thank you for appearing before the committee.

Rep Delmore: It was about the training.

Senator Lyson: Someone was wondering about states attorneys, they are already in the law, they are considered a law enforcement officer without a concealed weapon permit as long as they remain proficient. The training to get a permit, but that only allows you to carry it while you are

out away from buildings. He then goes on to explain how to obtain a permit and what the requirements are. A question was asked why does the retired law enforcement need the concealed weapon and the answer is most times you don't.

Rep Klemin: The question was why a North Dakota law enforcement officer would want to carry a concealed weapon in all of these other places.

Senator Lyson: I agree with you in some respects.

Rep Klemin: So what you are saying is that you need it for self defense.

Senator Lyson: For protection.

Rep Klemin: So if someone tries to shoot you, you can shoot back in a public place.

Senator Lyson: Well it depends on what the public place is, that is what our training is all about.

Rep Klemin: I understand that, but you were talking about someone who has been retired for twenty years.

Senator Lyson: If he is trained and he is proficient.

Rep Delmore: Are we putting others at risk in a public place.

Senator Lyson: That is a possibility.

Chairman DeKrey: If there are no further questions, thank you for appearing.

Senator Lyson: I should mention that the supreme court asked to be taken out of the bill.

Rep Maragos: They also have security in the court room.

<u>Chairman DeKrey</u>: If there is no further testimony, is there any one in opposition, neutral, we will close the hearing on SB 2257.
