Minutes: Chairman Krebsbach called the committee back to order and opened the hearing on SB 2284 which relates to the uniform service dates for wartime veterans. Appearing before the committee to introduce the proposed legislation was Representative Lonnie Winrich, District 18, cosponsor of the bill. He indicated that Senator Bereier is the prime sponsor of this bill as well. Representative Winrich indicated he would like to lend his support to the passage of SB 2284.

Dennis Boknecht, liaison between the veteran's legislative committee and the North Dakota Veteran's Coordinating Council. He presented written testimony to the committee. The hand out marked Appendix A was used for his presentation. It was felt that it would be best to simplify the bill so that there would not be a need to update the information it contains every session. Senator C. Nelson inquired about the inclusion dates for certain military involvement such as that in Bosnia. Why is it listed as 3 separate periods rather than 1 inclusive period? Rick Ryan indicated that there are different skirmishes, ribbons, operations, etc. It is not one inclusive date because of these differences. Other questions were offered by Senators C. Nelson and

Dever. At this point Senator Bercier, District 9, prime sponsor of the bill appeared before the committee. A copy of his written testimony is attached. There were no questions from the committee at this time. Basically what this bill does is clean up the references in code referring to various wars. It ensures that any future wars, skirmishes, etc. will be included in this law. There were no questions from the committee. The hearing was closed on SB 2284 at this time. Senator T. Mathern made a motion for a Do Pass on SB 2284, seconded by Senator Wardner. Roll Call Vote indicated 6 Yeas, 0 Nays, 0 Absent or Not Voting. Senator T. Mathern will carry the bill.

# Testimony Senator Dennis Bercier SB 2284 Senate Government and Veterans Affairs Committee February 2, 2001

Good morning Chairperson Krebsbach and members of the committee. I am Senator Dennis Bereier, District 9, Belcourt.

I am here to today, as prime sponsor of SB 2384, to ask for your favorable consideration of this piece of legislation.

This legislation is an attempt to simplify, update and put an end to having to change the code every time a new period of conflict makes members of our society eligible to be considered "wartime veterans" for purposes of our state's laws. This legislation has the unanimous support of the North Dakota Veterans Coordinating Council.

The proposed legislation simply removes all old references to various wars and conflicts in the current statute and replaces those with language which covers all past, present and future wars, conflicts or whatever they may be called. The current law does not have a specific listing for a lot of the qualifying wars or conflicts. In fact it does not have the correct dates for Vietnam. The United States Department of Defense does have all the listings which are easily accessible, as I have been told. There are various agencies and sources, such as the state's department of veterans affairs, the county veteran service officers and several federal agencies, which will have the information readily available for anyone who wants to access this information.

We must find ways, and be open, on how to keep our laws current and constituent friendly, without having to constantly be amending the code. This change does just that.

Your supporting a do pass recommendation would be appreciated.

## Appendix A: Wars, Campaigns and Expeditions of the Armed Forces Since WW II Which Qualify for Veterans' Preference

War Service Creditable for Veterans' Preference. In the absence of statutory definition for "war" and "campaign or expedition," OPM considers to be "wars" only those armed conflicts for which a declaration of war was issued by Congress. The title 38, U.S.C., definition of "period of war," which is used in determining benefits administered by the Department of Veterans Affairs, includes the Vietnam Era and other armed conflicts. That title 38 definition is NOT applicable for civil service purposes.

Thus the last "war" for which active duty is qualifying for veterans' preference is World War II. The inclusive dates for World War II service are December 7, 1941, through April 28, 1952.

Non-combat operations that are not qualifying for veterans' preference. Many medals are awarded for non-combat operations. These medals are not a basis for preference and include the following:

- The Medal of Merit for meritorious service in World War II.
- The Medal of Freedom for meritorious achievements or meritorious service to the United States on or after December 7, 1941, in the war against an enemy entside the continental limits of the United States.
- The Antarctica Service Medal for participating in a scientific, direct support, or exploratory operation on the Antarctic Continent.
- The National Defense Service Medal for honorable service between June 27, 1950 and July 27, 1954 or January 1, 1961 and August 14, 1974; or for the period between August 2, 1990, and November 30, 1995.
- The Armed Forces Service Medal for participation in a United States military operation deemed to be a significant activity for which there was no threat of encounter of foreign armed opposition or imminent threat of hostile action.
- The Armed Forces Reserve Medal for 10 years of honorable service in a Reserve component; or active duty service in a Reserve component on or after August 1, 1990; or volunteer service for active duty on or after August 1, 1990.

Military Operations Since 1937 for Which a Campaign or Expeditionary Medal Has Been Awarded, Except for Operations Occurring During a Declared War

Military personnel receive many awards and decorations. To help agencies make decisions concerning entitlement to veterans' preference and other benefits, the following list identifies those awards that are campaign and expeditionary medals. Any Armed Forces expeditionary Medal, whether listed here or not, http://www.opm.gov/veterans/html/vgmedal2.htm 2/1/01

is qualifying for veterans' preference. The Department of Defense, not OPM, determines who is entitled to receive a medal, and under what circumstances. The list below is derived from DoD 1348.33-M, Manual of Military Decorations and Awards.

DD 214, Certificate of Discharge or Separation from Active Duty, or other official documents issued by the branch of service are required as verification of eligibility for veterans' preference.
