Minutes: Senator Watne closed the hearing on SB 2301: A BILL FOR AN ACT TO CREATE AND ENACT A NEW SECTION TO CHAPTER 16.1-13 OF THE NORTH DAKOTA CENTURY CODE, RELATING TO PREPARATIONS FOR SPECIAL ELECTIONS TO FILL VACANCIES.

Senator Traynor, representing district 15 and speaking on behalf of Senator Holmberg. The question is what happens when there is a resignation. This bill would apply to any vacancy in a public office. Took 85 days to accomplish an election in connection to a regular November election.

Senator Nelson, why doesn't this differ with the bill we past last week.

Senator Watne, this deals only with special election.

Cory Fung, from the Secretary of States Office. With the passage of the other bill this isn't necessary. This bill does not come into play because there is 21 days to fill a vacancy. This bill would be better in chapter 44, and it would make more sense. On line 7 the term certain

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concerns me: I would add the word reasonably certain. The last point is the vacancy created by Clarence Martin, this bill will in way shorten.

Senator Bercier, give me an example of language on line 6.

Cory Fung, I can't answer that question reasonably.

Senator Bercier, Is this necessary, given the other bill?

Senator Lyson, we have a sheriff in towner county. If we asked the governor to replace him, will this then go into effect.

Cory Fung, yes if this bill passed it would apply to everyone.

Senator Dever, with our other piece of legislation would Senator St. Martin be covered?

Cory Fung, yes he could have resigned.

Senator Bercier, this bill is different. It covers a broad spectrum of elections.

Cory Fung, correct. The pittfall of this bill is someone resigns, then they decide to withdraw in order to allow another party member to fill their vacancy.

Senator Traynor, maybe a vacancy should be irrevocable after a resignation is submitted.

Jerry Jumstad, representing the league of cities, has no position on the bill. Doesn't know if this bill will directly effect cities. This won't apply to anyone.

Senator Lyson, I'm wondering if this will allow for resignations in cities?

Jerry Jumstad, I don't think this would.

Senator Watne, Cory, this will not to apply to judges, legislatures, cities. Who will this apply to?

Cory Fung, he probably is right that this bill will not apply to anyone. I think this would apply to judges.

Senator Nelson, we can wait untill next general election, not the special election.

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Senator Traynor closed the hearing on SB 2301.
