SENATOR TOM TRENBEATH of District 10 testified in support of SB 2345 to extent the black powder white tail hunting season from 9 days to an additional week. This would make sense for his area because of the possibly late sugar beet and potato harvest, they are overrun with white tail deer and thirdly because it is a great hunting experience.

MARK ROSTER although he is president of the North Dakota Muzzleloaders Association testified on his own behalf in support of SB 2345 (See attached testimony).

JOHN HORNER of Mandan ND, testified and wished to have his name on the roster in support of SB 2345.

MIKE DONAHUE, representing the United Sportsman and the North Dakota Wildlife Federation testified in support of SB 2345.

PAUL CRARY of the Cass County Wildlife Club wanted to be on record in support of SB 2345.



Chairman Rennerfeldt: I will call the House Natural Resources committee to order, call the roll.

Sen. Trenbeath - District 10: I have the honor of sponsoring this bill on behalf of hunters using Muzzle Loading weapons. I am not one of those hunters. I had a call from one of my constituents to sponsor this bill, as you may or may not know the Muzzle Loading season is after the deer season and often times then it suffers disabilities including firing a weapon that has a low muzzle velocity and having a skittish population of deer and also the weather is inclement. At present the season is 9 ½ days longs which encompasses 2 weekends. Often times people firing this kind of weapon are unable to take the field let alone get a shot, because of weather conditions. This bill

would lengthen that season another week and increase the odds of at least taking the fields. They tell me that odds of bagging an animal are not increased whatsoever. About 1 out of 3 fills their tags. The importance of this bill is to enable them to have a better chance at actually being in the field. I appreciate your positive consideration of this bill.

Chairman Rennerfeldt: Any questions of the committee?

Rep. Tieman - District 10; I am here this morning to speak in favor of this bill. These are some very good people, I just feel this is a very good bill and I would hope for your favorable consideration.

<u>Chairman Rennerfeldt:</u> Any questions from the committee? Anyone else care to testify in favor of this bill?

<u>Loren Sterner - Cass County Wildlife Club:</u> We support this bill because it provides more opportunity for sportsmen to be out in the field. We get more hours in the field.

<u>Chairman Rennerfeldt:</u> Any questions of the committee? Anyone else care to testify in favor of SB 2345?

Rep. Weiler: A question just occurred to me. Can Sen. Tieman answer this. Since there is an increase in the amount of days, is there going to be an increase in licensing fees?

Sen. Tieman: It doesn't account for an increase in licensing fees and frankly that's something that has never been considered. Maybe we should be paying these guys to shoot some of our excessive deer.

Chairman Rennerfeldt: Is there any opposition to SB 2345?

Rep. DeKrey: Can Roger Rostvedt from Game and Fish comment?

Chairman Rennerfeldt: Roger, do you have any comments?

Rep. DeKrey: Do you anticipate this affecting the other deer gun seasons, license numbers, greater harvest, or any affects of this bill?

Roger Rostvedt - ND Game and Fish: In discussing this bill, there are no significant changes right now, it would actually be a more consistent harvest, because right now you are talking weather conditions and mis-firing. It would probably lead to a more consistent harvest.

Rep. DeKrey: So from a management standpoint, you guys really don't care?

Rostyedt: No.

<u>Chairman Rennerfeldt:</u> There is plenty of deer out there and this would give them a little more opportunity to pick and choose better weather?

Rostvedt: Better weather, right now those success rates do fluctuate based on the weather.

December is tough to get two weekends together.

Rep. Klein: I was wondering about the possibility of an amendment stating the season would be extended if the weather was bad. 16 days, we have a lot of people complaining out there already about the hunters running around.

Rostvedt: When you take a look at the numbers currently in the law right now, it limits them to 2% of the regular deer gun season. On a statewide basis that is about 1700 people out there, divided by 53 counties and you don't see them.

Rep. Nottestad: Give a short description of the number of complaints you have on muzzle loader hunters as far as call ins on violations perceived or whatever.

Rostvedt: Generally it is very, very low, simply because when you spread those people out, it is a low impact activity.

Mike Donahue - ND Wildlife Federation and United Sportsmen: In support of SB 2345. (see written testimony).

Rep. Weiler: I just have one question, if it says here that the Governor shall provide than there is not a concern about him may or may not, he has to do it?

Rep. Nottestad: The important thing is that this is the same wordage as regular gun season so if they cut the gun season down to 2 ½ days and we put the sixteen days for muzzle loader season there would be a 2 ½ day regular season and a 16 day muzzle loader season and that is where the inequity comes in. I think this is an excellent amendment.

Rep. Weiler: And again, I know we took out the amount of days, you don't want to put any limitations on it?

Rep. Nottestad: There is no number of days on the rifle season, that is set by Game and Fish.

This gives them the opportunity to set the muzzle loading season also.

Rep. Weiler: As long as you guys aren't concerned about it, that's fine.

SENATOR CHRISTMANN, Chairman of the Conference Committee for SB 2334 opened the meeting.

Roll call was taken with SENATOR CHRISTMANN, TOLLEFSON, REPRESENTATIVES NOTTESTAD, KLEIN and HANSON present. SENATOR KELSH who with the change of schedule had a prior scheduled meeting and was late in attending the meeting.

The Representatives explained the rational of their amendments, stating that they had no problem with leaving the muzzle loading hunting season at 16 1/2 days, but why should it be left in statute as it is not necessary. Of all the hunting season except migratory waterfowl, there is nothing set up in statute as to the number of days for a season. They visited with the Game & Fish Department who has no problem with the 16 1/2 days, but if something happens that the deer season needs to be cut short, the 16 1/2 days set for muzzle loading hunting would still have to happen because it is set in statute. That is why if the season is set by proclamation the season

could be adjusted to solve any problems. The season was originally in law because there was not a season and this was used to develop the season.

Discussion was held as to the numbers of licenses issued, harvest numbers the by muzzle loading hunting season and if there was any management problems by the Game & Fish Department.

SENATOR CHRISTMANN explained the Senate Committee did not concur because the sponsor intent was to extend the muzzle loading hunting season and with the changes the bill was taking a different route and heading to in a different direction.

<u>SENATOR TOLLEFSON</u> made a motion for the Senate to accede to the House Amendments of SB 2345.

REPRESENTATIVE NOTTESTAD second the motion,

SENATOR CHRISTMANN called for the roll vote of SB 2345 indicating 5 YAYS, 1 NAY,

AND 0 ABSENT OR NOT VOTING.

For the record, my name is Mark Roster. I live in Davenport, ND.

I am writting to you in regards to SB 2345. I hope to be to the hearing in person to testify, but there is a chance of a snowstorm on Thursday, so I am also e mailing you my testimony, just in case weather conditions keep me from

I am the current President of the North Dakota Muzzleloaders Ass oc but come to you as a individual and not as a "voice of a organization" simply because our Association does not have their next meeting until this Saturd ay!

Over the years (since 1987), the muzzleloading season has steadily grown in numbers of available licenses and length of season, due to increas ed interest. This has been a positive impact to many.

Also, over the years, we have seen several weekends stormed out. Weekends are where the majority of the time is spent in the field hunting. This last

year (2000) season, we had storms both the first weekend and the 1 ast weekend

here in the eastern part of the state. And as you may know, when it storms,

the animals "hole up", just like people! Even if you do risk dang er to be

out, your chance of being successful is near zero. The last Sunday, temps

hovered around -15 below with 10-20 mph winds. So hunters lost vertually 4

days out of the 9.5 and MOST do not get out during the week. By a dding the

additional week (making the season 16.5 days), you will be giving the

muzzleloaders a chance for a few extra days in the field, as GENER

ALLY the probability of storms 3 weekends in a row are slim - although we have all seen it happen.

This also puts the muzzleloaders on a equal number of hunting days as the regular rifle season.

Will passage of this bill increase the percentage of deer harvested? The answer to that is a flat out "NO". You can go to any state in the lower 48 that keeps statistics of deer harvested by muzzleloader and that statistic hoovers around 36-38 percent. Even 2 years ago with the "beautiful" December weather, success was around that percentage. No matter length of season (many states have 3-4 weeks, and yes there are some that have less), or the number of available licenses (Nebraska gives out about 8,000 muzzleloading tags), the percent harvested remains at 36-38 percent.

Very similar to the archery seasons success rate, with their near 100 days of season and many more hunters. I do not have a number of licenses sold for bow, but muzzleloaders are 2% of the total whitetail licenses available - this year, around 1,750 before gratis tag issue.

Some ranching and farming opponents of this bill may claim, hunting season is too long the way it is - or they are tired of the road hunters, thus they are against it.

MOST muzzleloaders would not even be recognized as hunters if we were not wearing the saftey orange (which I believe in). MOST muzzleloader hunters are going from point A to point B to hunt - they are not road hunters.

Granted, if they spot a deer on the way to point B, and it is on unposted land, they may give fair chase or if posted they may ask the landowner for

permission, but as a whole they have a destination to reach to hun t in a manner most conducive to the arm they are using. Slow loading and one shot, in close for a humane kill. Not driving around and taking shots f rom the road or vehicle (which we all know is illegal but regretfully done If muzzleloading hunters were not wearing orange, they would be ne arly as unintrusive as the archery hunter and MOST landowners would not ev en know there is a open season except for the occasional "BOOM". 1,750 hu statewide do not make much of a impact.

To pass this bill, the legislation does not have to spend any mone y for a good will gesture!

I urge you to vote "yes" for the passage of SB 2345.
