Minutes: SB 2390 relates to passing an authorized emergency vehicle.

John Olson: (ND State's Attorneys; ND Peace Officers Association; Supports) States dangerous conditions are being caused by passing motorists for law enforcement and emergency instances. One concern with bill is on page 1, line 20. Need to put "amber" in there also, so an amendment is needed. He states an example where he had a chance to see the differences of awareness and reactions of citizens involving flashing lights. This is a safety issue.


Senator Trenbeath: What's the penalty?

John Olson: I don't know.

Senator Stenehjem: If you amend for "amber" (lights), do you have to pull over for wrecker and construction, etc?

John Olson: You don't have to pull over, just move over. It's for your own safety

Senator Espegard: What's the difference between section 1 and section 2?



John Olson: Section 1 is meeting oncoming emergency vehicles. Section 2 deals with parked or stopped emergency vehicles.

Lois Hartman: (ND Firefighter's Association; Lobbyist 449; Supports) States there have been a number of cases where firefighters and EMT's have been killed alongside highways.

Keith Sorenson: (ND EMS Association; Supports) This is an important issue. There have been a number of cases where drivers almost took him out. This is a very good bill.

Senator Stenehjem: How does this affect the Expressway or any multilane road?

Jonh Olson: Definition of highway and roadway includes all streets, highways, even in mobile home courts.

Senator Stenehjem: The wordage "police officer" in bill may need to be changed.

Senator O'Connell: I've been in these situations and it's dangerous out there. I've seen ambulance personnel directing traffic.

Senator Trenbeath: What concerns me is all the qualifiers in this bill.

John Olson: The reason for this provision is to announce policy, it's not a provision where law enforcement will seek out to convict.

Senator Stenehjem: I see what you're trying to get at. Maybe we should have a section added for multilane rural roads.


John Olson: That's certainly within your prerogative but I personally feel like this proposed bill works anywhere.

Minutes: Rep. Weisz - Chairman opened the hearing on SB 2390 as engrossed; A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-10-26 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to passing an authorized emergency vehicle.

Sen. Tallackson: I represent District 16 of Grafton. North Dakota. This bill was introduced for the safety of our peace officers -- it involves when an emergency vehicle stops and -- it was amended in the senate to leave out the cities, so it is just the highways -- when an emergency vehicle is stop if it a two lane road -- four lanes actually -- two weeks each way the law requires you to move over to the lane with all the possible care you can -- it for the safety of the officers. I know of officers who have been struck because the car didn't move over. So that's what this bill is -- we have other people to testify on this.

John Olson: I represent the North Dakota Peace Officers Association and the North Dakota states Attorneys who support the bill.

Rep. Weisz - Chairman (2168) Does this include -- If the highway patrol has stopped somebody for speeding on the side of the road -- would all vehicles have to stop?

John Olson: No, I don't believe that the vehicles have to stop but they can proceed with caution.

There was an amendment put in the senate which also added 'amber' to the lights. As you probably know, when the highway patrolman have somebody stopped for speeding they switch from red or blue to amber.

Major John Grasl: I am from the North Dakota Highway Patrol. We are in support of this bill. A little over a year ago we had an officer struck. He was from the Fargo area. He was struck because a vehicle did not move over for an amber light as is alluded to in this bill. He has yet to return to work. Every year we have several of our vehicles struck while either checking traffic accidents or traffic stops. I believe by enacting this bill requiring motorists of the Interstate and four lanes to pull into the other lanes would be a good safety feature law enforcement in this state.

Rep. Weisz - Chairman (2340) This includes the Interstate Highways?

Major Grasl: Yes sir because the traffic is moving in the same direction -- even if we had one stopped they can move to the other lane -- even if it were one the inside lane they would be required to move to the outside lane because some accidents an occur in the medians.

Rep. Hawken: (2364) It has been a few years since I have taken highway safety -- on the interstate, if there is an emergency coming toward you are you required to do anything if you are in the other lane?

Major Grasl: No, if you are -- say if we have someone stopped in the eastbound lane and you are in the west bound lane - - no there is no requirement for you to take any action.

Rep. Hawken: (2410) On a two lane then -- what your response be?

Major Grasl: On a two lane road -- with the amber lights activated -- just slow down and proceed with caution. Other states have similar legislation like this -- with the amber lights activated they have a speed limit which goes into effect -- in other words you must slow down to a certain speed and then proceed after that -- you do not have that in this bill.

Rep. Hawken: (2461) One more -- so now you are going down the highway and an emergency Comes up behind you -- is it like in town -- you pull over and stop.

Major Grasl: If the red lights are activated which is pursuing -- which they normally wouldn't be pursuing -- (they would be -- Rep. Hawken) -- then you are required to pull to the right and stop until the vehicle passes.

Rep. Thoreson: (2510) When you stop a person -- like on the Interstate - - why don't you have Them proceed to an approach and pull off rather than have them stop on the roadway and deal with the problem there?

Major Grasl: Are you referring to the median side on a cross over? Or near an interchange--(yes --Rep. 'Thoreson) -- where they could get off safely? In most cases we do instruct our officers to move those vehicles off the roadway to a safe place--but it doesn't necessarily happen at all times because of circumstances in the vehicle at the time -- it depends on what the vehicle was stopped for -- if you have a driver suspected to be under the influence -- it would not be prudent to let the driver proceed down the road in an unsafe manner to an exit or anywhere else.

Rop. Ruby: (2642) If you have some pulled over for speeding and you have the lights and somebody in the other lane didn't comply -- how would you expect to catch up them?

Major Grasl: Without the law -- currently in existence -- I believe that Indiana that currently has that law -- the enforcement of that is really questionable how we would do that -- if we get a plate number off that vehicle and go after that vehicle once we are done with the traffic stop -- or if at the right time when we work radar in groups we could call ahead or if we had aircraft working then they would take care of it.

Rep. Weisz - Chairman there being one else wishing to appear for or against the hearing is closed for receiving further testimony. (2753).
