Minutes:

SENATOR ERBELE; Sponsor, introduced the bill to the committee. This bill simply adds bison, sheep, and pigs to the list of animals that can be used as raffle prizes.

BARBARA WICKEL; Executive Director of North Dakota Buffalo Association, testified in support of the bill.

KEITH LAUER; Director of Gaming Division, Attorney General Office, testified in the neutral position. A single cash prize can't exceed \$1,000 and total cash prizes in one day can't exceed \$3,000. The amount is determined by the donor of the animal. To my knowledge there has not been a problem with raffling animals.

SENATOR WANZEK; Isn't it possible that some of the animals are worth more than \$1,000? KEITH LAUER; The reason the cash limitations were put in there was to prevent organizations from starting lotteries on a daily basis. The prize has to be able to be converted into cash so that the person winning it would not have to take the animal if they didn't want it.

SENATOR WANZEK: How technical is the enforcement?

KEITH LAUER; According to the bill it is up to the donor to decide what the value of the animal is.

The hearing was closed.

Discussion was held.

SENATOR KLEIN moved for a DO PASS on this bill.

SENATOR URLACHER seconded the motion.

SENATOR URLACHER; Is this \$1,000 limitation going to make this workable?

SENATOR ERBELE; I believe it would, the winner of that animal can take the \$1,000 or turn around and sell the animal and get more than \$1,000 that is fine.

SENATOR KROEPLIN; They have found a way of handling it when they raffle off cars, it should be workable.

SENATOR WANZEK; Did you talk with the sheep and pig people, was this something they requested also?

SENATOR ERBELE; The attorney at the Legislative Council drafting the bill asked if sheep and pigs should be added.

Roll call vote: 6 Yeas, 0 No, 0 Absent and Not voting.

SENATOR ERBELE will carry the bill.
