Minutes: Rep. Weisz - Chairman opened the hearing on HB 2421; A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 2-0501 of the North Dakota Century code, relating to the aeronautics commission.

Sen. Gary Nelson: I represent the 22nd District in the State Senate. I am the sponsor of SB 2421 and I appear today in support of this bill. It is a very simple bill as you can see. I was contacted by a member of the Aeronautics Commission who thought the number of years he had been on the commission --- receiving \$20 a day --- perhaps it was time we take a look at what that amount of compensation should be to the members of the commission. When I introduced the bill I left it to the discretion of the commission to set own compensation. The Senate Committee didn't feel comfortable with that -- so they put \$75 per day in -- rather than leaving to the discretion of the Commission. That is all that the bill does. The other changes are grammatical and updating language.

The Commission members have been debating making this request to the Legislative body for several sessions. The discussion was again held on Dec 10th, at the last Commission meeting held in Bismarck. The decision was made to ask Senator Nelson if he would sponsor a Bill to increase the meeting fees. This requested increase is the first for the Commission since **its** creation in the original legislative action of the 1947 session.

The Commission normally meets four times a year. The early summer meeting is considered the **Grant Meeting**. At this gathering we typically host about 20 to 30 communities that are asking for funding for airport projects across the State.

The funding of requests typically exceed \$2,000,000.00 with about \$500,000.00 to fund the requests, this is a process that is understandably very difficult. This board takes the challenge on and normally does a remarkable job assigning the \$'s to the projects that compliment the Statewide airport system.

The remaining meeting dates are usually scheduled to deal with regulatory concerns. The ever changing environment in Washington DC keeps us all in a continued state of wonderment and the Commissions input to the national concerns is most important to get onto the record in DC.

This request is presented to the Legislative body with due consideration and when approved will not cause a financial burden on the Commission's budget.


