Bismarck, March 27, 2001

The Senate convened at 1:00 p.m., with President Dalrymple presiding.

The prayer was offered by Pastor Matthew Putz, Century Baptist Church, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present except Senator Erbele.

A quorum was declared by the President.

REPORT OF DELAYED BILLS COMMITTEE

MR. PRESIDENT: Your **Delayed Bills Committee (Sen. Solberg, Chairman)** has approved the introduction of a concurrent resolution urging Congress to direct the Secretary of Agriculture and the federal Risk Management Agency to establish a pricing policy so crop revenue coverage for durum can be continued.

The resolution will be SCR 4050.

REPORT OF DELAYED BILLS COMMITTEE

MR. PRESIDENT: Your **Delayed Bills Committee (Sen. Solberg, Chairman)** has approved the introduction of a concurrent resolution urging Congress to take any and all measures necessary to guard against the spread of all livestock diseases, including hoof and mouth disease and bovine spongiform encephalopathy, and to encourage aggressive efforts on the part of other countries with a view to eradicating these diseases with all possible celerity.

The resolution will be SCR 4051.

MOTION

SEN. CHRISTMANN MOVED that Senate Rule 329(4) be amended to read "fifty-fifth legislative day" in place of "fifty-second legislative day", thereby extending the deadline for referral of bills to the **Appropriations Committee**, which motion prevailed.
