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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5	SECTION 1. State academic content standards - Development. The superintendent
6	of public instruction shall develop and distribute to each school district and nonpublic school
7	state academic content standards for all core subject areas applicable to grades four, eight, and
8	twelve. The superintendent of public instruction shall revise the state academic content
9	standards required by this section at least once every five years and distribute the revised
10	standards to each school district and nonpublic school.
11	SECTION 2. State academic content standards - Alternate academic content

- 1. Before the beginning of the 2002-03 school year, each school district and each nonpublic school shall:
 - Adopt the state academic content standards applicable to grades four, eight,
 and twelve in the areas of mathematics, English language arts, science, and
 social studies; or
 - b. Adopt or develop alternate academic content standards applicable to grades four, eight, and twelve in the areas of mathematics, English language arts, science, and social studies, provided the alternate academic content standards are determined by the superintendent of public instruction to be equal to or more rigorous than the state standards.
