## REENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2361

- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 14-02.1-02.1 of the North Dakota Century  
2 Code, relating to information provided by the state department of health regarding pregnancy,  
3 childbirth, and adoption; and to provide an appropriation.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 14-02.1-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code  
6 is amended and reenacted as follows:

7 **14-02.1-02.1. Printed information - Referral service.**

- 8 1. The state department of health shall ~~cause to be published~~ publish in English, and  
9 in every other language that the department determines is the primary language of  
10 a significant number of state residents, ~~within one hundred eighty days after July 1,~~  
11 ~~1991,~~ the following easily comprehensible printed materials:
- 12 a. Geographically indexed materials designed to inform the woman of public and  
13 private agencies and services available to assist a woman through  
14 pregnancy, upon childbirth, and while the child is dependent, including  
15 adoption agencies. The materials must include a comprehensive list of the  
16 agencies available, a description of the services they offer and a description  
17 of the manner, including telephone numbers, in which they might be  
18 contacted, or, at the option of the department, printed materials including a  
19 toll-free, twenty-four hour a day telephone number that may be called to  
20 obtain, orally, such a list and description of agencies in the locality of the  
21 caller and of the services they offer. Any information or material distributed  
22 under this section must indicate whether an agency listed in the materials  
23 provides abortion counseling or referral services or advocates for or performs  
24 abortions.

b. Materials designed to inform the woman of the probable anatomical and physiological characteristics of the fetus at two-week gestational increments from the time when a woman can be known to be pregnant to full term, including any relevant information on the possibility of the survival of the fetus and pictures representing the development of a fetus at two-week gestational increments. The pictures must contain the dimensions of the fetus and must be realistic and appropriate for the stage of pregnancy depicted. The materials must be objective, nonjudgmental, and designed to convey only accurate scientific information about the fetus at the various gestational ages.

2. The materials required under this section must be reviewed, updated, and if needed, reprinted at least once every four years, must be available at no cost from the state department of health upon request and in appropriate number to any person, facility, or hospital, and must be available on the department's internet website.

3. The department shall contract with a nonprofit private entity for the establishment and operation of a statewide, toll-free telephone referral service through which a person seeking services to assist a woman through pregnancy, childbirth, or adoption is referred to an appropriate service agency. The department, through the toll-free telephone referral service, may not refer a person to any agency that provides abortion counseling or referral services or advocates for or performs abortions.

**SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$39,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state department of health, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003, for the purpose of contracting with a nonprofit entity for the establishment and operation of a statewide, toll-free telephone referral service through which a person seeking services to assist a woman through pregnancy, childbirth, or adoption is referred to an appropriate service agency.
